In the Name of God Amen. I William Howell of Surry County being Sick and
weak in body but of perfect sense and memory thanks be given to Almighty therefore I do make
and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament in manner as followeth.

First and principally I bequeath my Soul into the hand of Almighty God my Creator & Jesus
Christ my Redeemer fully trusting in his Merits for Remission of all my Sins and for what
I have done, I beseech God to bless me with in this life. I do dispose of as is hereafter Expressed
I bequeath to my Son William Howell my plantation with all the Land thereunto belong-
ing to him and his heirs for ever, and one feather bed and ~~cover~~ one rug, one pare of Blankets, one
Iron kettle, about seven Gallons, one Iron pestle, one Lasking Glass, one Cow, a white & black
heffer, one red Sow, big with pigs, about three years old, one black Sow about two year and a half
old, two Carrows about four years old, and in Consideration of the above said Gift I do order my son

William Howell to pay to Cap^t Will^m Browne or his Order thirteen pounds Curr^t money
I also give my Son William one Large pewter flat dish and one Large pewter deep dish and

one small Gun that is called his own, and one Iron pot containing about two Gallons & a half
I bequeath to my Son Edmond Howell one feather bed, one rug, and pare of Blankets, one Cow,
one small Gun, seven head of hogs, Carrows and Sows, one two year old heffer and one year old

heffer both brown, three Sheep, three pewter dishes, and one Silver Seal of his own name, his ax, &
his hoe, half a dozen of spoons and one Large new deep dish & one seven Gallons Iron pot
I bequeath to my Son Thomas Howell one feather bed, one pare of Blankets, one Sheat, six young &
old hogs, and one two Gallon Iron pot, one Large Deep pewter dish, & four Sheep, one pide Cow and

one Crown heffer
I bequeath to my Son In^o Howell five sheep, one brown white faced Cow, and one Cow almost white
six hogs, one Large Deep pewter dish and my horse Cart and harness

I bequeath to my Daughter Joan Aldbrooke wife of Samuel Aldbrooke one four year old heffer, one
Large deep pewter dish two sheep and two hogs

I bequeath to my Daughter Eliz^a Fitchett one Large deep pewter dish and two Sheep (and I also
give my Daughter Joan three small pewter dishes)

I bequeath all the rest of my Estate unto my Son Will^m after my just Debts and funerall Expens-
es are satisfied and I also appoint my son Will^m to be my full & Sole Executor of this my Last Will
and I also appoint my two friends Cap^t Will^m Browne and Nick^o Magget to see this my Will performed -
