body but of perfect Sense and memory thanks be given to Almighty God therefor doe make and Ordain this  
my last Will and Testament as followeth.

First I bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God my Creator and Jesus Christ my Redeemer fully  
Trusting in his Meritts for Remission of all my Sins and for what Estate it hath Pleas'd God to bless me  
with in this Life I doe dispose of as is hereafter Express.

I bequeath to my Brother W<sup>m</sup> White all my Wearing Apparel and my Chest Except my great Coat.

- 1. Bequeath to my Uncle *Sp. Moring* all the Account that is between us Excepting Money. —
- 2. Bequeath to my son John Humphrys son of my Sister Mary Humphrys thirty Shill. to be laid out on him in Learning. —
- 3. Bequeath the next two of the eldest of my aforesaid Sister Marys Children twenty Shillings to be laid out on them in Learning. —
- 4. I desire that my feather bed and all the furniture that doth belong to it Should be Sold as soon as convenient only it can for Money, by my Exec<sup>r</sup> and the Produce thereof to be paid to my son *John Humphrys* when he shall com<sup>e</sup> to Lawfull Age. —
- 5. Bequeath to my Sister *Eizabeth White* five Pounds. —
- 6. Bequeath to my Brother *Walter White* my Great Coat and my bridle and Saddle. —
- 7. Bequeath to my son *Sp. Moring* my whole Duty of Swan and to *John Moring* my Common Prayer book. —
- 8. Bequeath to my brother *Charles Whites* three Children each of them twenty Shill. to put them to School. —
- 9. And I give to *Thomas and Mary Wronn* each a Bible of five Shill. and Six pence price. —
- 10. Bequeath to my Brother *Walter White* three Children to each of them twenty Shill. to putt them to School out of the Debt their father Oweth me. —
- 11. Bequeath all the rest of my Estate to my brother *Charles White* after my just debts are paid. —
- 12. I make and Ordaine my Brother *Charles White* my full Sole Executor of this my Last Will in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seale this 14<sup>th</sup> day of March 1728. —

**This Indenture** Made this thirteenth day of May in the Year of Our Lord God One Thousand Seven hundred twenty and eight Between Thomas Wickes of the County of *St. George* of the one Part and Richard Tomlinson of the County of the other part Witnesses that the said Thomas Wickes for divers good causes and Valuable Considerations to him in hand paid by the s<sup>r</sup> Richard Tomlinson and before the unsealing and delivery hereof being eight Pounds current money the receipt whereof the said Thomas Wickes doth hereby Acknowledge and shew with to be fully satisfied and payed and doeth hereby discharge and Acquit the s<sup>r</sup> Richard Tomlinson of the s<sup>d</sup> eight Pounds Shillings given granted Aliened, bargained, and sold and by these Presents dooth fully, clearly, and absolutely give grant Alien, bargain, and sell unto the said Richard Tomlinson his heirs and Assignes for ever all that tract or parcel of Land containing one hundred and fifty Acres more or less lying and being

In the name of God Amen the eighth day of December In y<sup>e</sup> year of Our Lord God One thousand seven hundred and Twenty Nine, I John White of Lyons Creek Parish in the County of Surrey being sick & weak of body but of a sound and Perfect Memory Praised be God for it doe make this my Last Will & Testament and first I Renounce all former Wills & Testaments by me made & done as for my Soul I recommend into the hands of Almighty God that gave it me and as for my body I leave it to be buried in a Decent Christian like manner at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned and as for all my Worldly goods wherewith it hath Pleas'd Almighty God to bless me I give and bequeath in manner & form following Viz

- Impress, I Give and bequeath unto my Son in Law Thomas Lawrence one feather Bed and Rugg and one pair of Blanketts commonly called the Little bed now in y<sup>e</sup> house of the said Thomas Lawrence and fifteen head of Cattle and two horses commonly call'd or known by y<sup>e</sup> Names of Shafer & Mize and all my whole Stock of hogs both young and Old
- Item, I Give and bequeath unto my Cozen Sarah Keys a Heafear commonly called the White faced heafear of all her increase now at the Plantation of Thomas Lawrences, to her and her heirs
- Item, I Give and bequeath unto my Granson William Morris a brown Heafear now at y<sup>e</sup> Plantation of Thomas Lawrences and her Increase to him & his heirs
- Item, I Give and bequeath unto my Granson John Lawrence one feather bed and one Rugg and a pair of Blanketts One Sheet and three Pewter Dishes and three pewter Plates now at the house of Thomas Lawrences
- Item, I Give and bequeath unto my Granddaughter Elizabeth Lawrence one feather bed and furniture thereunto belonging now at Hubards Harells and three pewter Dishes and three pewter Plates at Hubards Harells house
- Lastly, I Give and bequeath all and Whole the Residue of my Estate both Real and Personable to my above named Son in Law Thomas Lawrence after paying my Just Debts and Likewise I constitute and Appoint him the said Thomas Lawrence my whole and Sole Executor of this my Last Will and Testament Revoking and Renouncing all former Wills and Testaments by me made and don.
