though sick in body yet of perfect and sound memory praised be Almighty God for the same Do make
this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following That is to say first I bequeath
soul and spirit into the hands of Almighty God my heavenly Father by whose free Grace I hope to
be saved and receive full pardon of my sins and my body in hope of a joyful Resurrection I commit to
the earth to be Decently buried in such manner and in such place as my Executor hereafter Mentioned shall
think most proper and Touching the Distribution of my mortal Goods which it has pleased God to
give me I Dispose of the same as followeth first I will that all such Debts as I owe at the time of
Death be Truly paid

Item I give and bequeath to my brother Edmund Hubbard my Negro man named Ned to him and to his heirs
for ever

Item I give and bequeath to my Kinsman John Tyler my Negro boy named Nick to him and to his heirs
for ever

Item I give and bequeath to my brother Edmund Hubbard my plantation lying and being at Micherring
to him and to his heirs with the stock there resident for ever also Abraham Sauls Account

Item I give and bequeath my horse I had of John Stevens to my Kinswoman Ann Shunt

Item Lastly all the rest of my Goods Chattels Lands Tenements Hereditaments whatsoever Also all
Cattle hogs Sheep horses Jewels of silver or gold all other moveables both Quick and Dead of what na
ture or Quality whatsoever not herein bequeathed I do by These presents give and bequeath to
my Kinsman George Shunt whom I make and ordain Sole Executor of this my Last Will and Tes
tament utterly revoking all other Wills and Testaments by me at any time heretofore made
