In the name of God Amen the Tenth day of December in the year of Our Lord God 1726. I Joseph Collier of Southwark Parishes in the County of Surry being very sick and weak in body but of sound and perfect memory thanks be to Almighty God therefore calling to mind the Mortality of my body and knowing that it is Appointed for all men once to die do make and ordaine this my Last Will and Testament that is to say Principally and first of all I Give & Recommend my Soule into the hands that gave it and for my body I commend it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like & decent manner at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named nothing doubting but at the Generall Resurrection I shall receive the same againe by the mighty Power of God and as Touching such worldly Estate where with it has pleased God to bless me with in this Life I Give devise and dispose of the same in the followin^g manner and forme.

I Give and bequeath unto my Son John Collier a certain Tract or parcell of Land whereon he now liveth being part of the Tract whereon I now dwell and is bounded by a line as followeth beginning at a Posten and running up a branch to the head thereof thence a strait Course to a White Oak a Corner

Free

Free in Caleb Elles his Line containing by Estimacion One hundred Acres be the same more or less To him the said John and his heirs for ever I also give unto my said Son John what how should I have I Lent him when he was Married, also I give him a set of Shoe makers Tools after the Decease of my Wife.

Item

I give and bequeath To my Son Joseph Collier a Tract of Land being part of the Land I now live on and is bounded by a line as followeth. Beginning at the Bowling Alley line thence down a Little branch to the Long tree thence a Strait Course to the head of a Merry branch that goes into a branch called Abrahams branch containing by Estimacion one hundred Acres be the same more or less to him the said Joseph Collier and his heirs for ever, also I give him a Lito gray mare which he has in Possession, and also a middle sized Gun and my Coopers Tools.

Item

I give and bequeath To my Son William Collier a Tract of Land being part of the Land I thereon I now dwell and is bounded as followeth. Beginning at the mouth of the horse going over branch to up the branch to the head thereof thence a Strait Course to Josephs line containing by Estimacion one hundred Acres be the same more or less to him the said William and his heirs for ever and also one Trading Gun.

Item

I give and bequeath unto my Son Thomas Collier all the remaining part of my Land and the Plantation whereon I now dwell after the Decease of my wife which I give to him & his heirs for ever also I give to my said Son Tho. a high coliver gun.

My Will is and it is my Will that if any or Either of my above named Sons should happen to die without Lawfull heires begotten of their body as John and William, & Joseph and Thomas that their Part shall fall to the survivor of them that is if William survives John or John survives William also if Joseph survives Thomas or Thomas survives Joseph by reason their Lands Inquest as They are named

Item

I give unto my Daughter Mary one Cow & Calf or the Value to her & her heirs for ever

Item

I give unto my Daughter Jane one Cow & Calf or the Value to her & her heirs for ever when she is married

Item

I give unto my daughter Elizabeth one Cow & Calf or the Value when she is married to her & her heirs for ever

Item

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah one Cow & Calf or the Value when she is Married, to her & her heirs for ever.

Item

I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Jean one feather bed & furniture To be at her own disposing & all the Rest of my Estate in whatsoever nature it may be found after all my just debts are paid, all which I give to my Aforesaid Wife during her Naturall Life & after her Decease To be Equally divided between my Eight Children.

I do also give unto my Wife Jean A Mare bridle & Saddle a Small gilded Trunk & Two Gold Rings to be at her own disposing at her death. — I do also Appoint my Loving Wife Jean To be my Whole & Sole Executors of this my Last Will and Testament To see the same fully performed According to the True Intent & meaning thereof Witness my hand and Seal the day & year Above Written.
