Item I give and bequeath to my Eldest Son Nicholas one Negro woman named Mary & four hundred Acres of Land Joyning to the plantation whereone I now live to him and his Heirs begotten of his body for ever

Item I give & bequeath to my Son John Three hundred and fifty Acres of Land lying on the West Side of Parkers branch beginning one the head of a meadow called the great Spring Down the branch binding one the Swamp to him and his Heirs begotten of his body for ever

Item I give and bequeath to my Son Thomas Winkles with Three hundred and fifty Acres of Land Joyning to it to him and his Heirs begotten of his body for ever

Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Three hundred & fifty Acres of Land lying one the North Side of the mery branch to her & her Heirs Lawfully begotten of her body for ever

Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter Ann Three hundred & fifty Acres of Land Lying one the Northward Side of the Reedy branch to her & her Heirs begotten of her body for ever

Item I give and bequeath to the Child which my wife now goes with Three hundred & fifty Acres of Land lying one the East Side of the reedy branch Joyning to the manner plantation Line to his or her Heirs begotten of his or her body for ever

And the real of my worldly Goods it is my will & Desire to be Equally Divided between all my Children and I do hereby utterly Disallow Revok & Disanull all and every other former Testaments Wills and Legacies bequests Executors by me in any ways before this Time named Willed & bequeathed Ratifying and Confirming This and no other to be my Last Will & Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seals the Day and Year above Written

In the name of God Amen The Last Will & Testament of Margaret Funnicutt of Lawnes Creek parish in the County of Surry being sick and weak in body but of sound Disposing memory Do Ordain this my Last Will and Testament Imprimis I bequeath my Soul to God hoping by the merits of Jesus Christ to have Everlasting Salvation Item my Body to the Earth to be Decently buried at the Discretion of my Executors as shall be hereafter named as for what worldly goods God hath bestowed upon me my Debts and Funerall Charges being paid I bestow and give as followeth I give to my Daughter Elizabeth the wife of Edward Dowell one feather bed & bolster rugg blanketts Sheets and Curtaines & Vallants now standing in my outward Room and to her son Richard Dowell one yearling heifer I give to my Daughter Mary the wife of Bray Haregrove one Cow & Two pewter Dishes I give to Margaret

Wherefore one Doe I give to my Daughter Katherine the wife of Charles Pitt one Cow and to her Daughter Anne one yearling heifer I give to my Daughter Anne the wife of Augustin Doryman Three female Cattle upwards of two years old & one feather bed and the furniture belonging to it and two Dues & one Ram and six Chairs & one Table with a Drawer in it & one warming pan and a Spittle and one pewter Tankard one brass Candle stick one brass Kettle pretty Large and one Kettle of a bout a Gallon and one small one & two Iron pots the biggest & the Least with pot hooks and one pot racks and four pewter basons one Dozen of plates & three porringers and one brass Tadle and two painted Cups & one pye plate one salt cellar and all my Earthen ware and two Stone Dugger a pair of bellows a pair of Tongues a flesh fork a grede Iron a spice mortar and pestle and one large Chest and one Cover and one box Iron and heaters one Doz. of spoons one meal Sifter a pale a Tigger a powdering Tubb a washing Tubb and my best gound & Delicoale I give to Martha the Daughter of my Son Augustin Kunnicut six plates a brass Candle stick and a wrought Tankard Item I give to my Daughter Anne the wife of Augustin Doryman one good pewter Dish and two old pewter Dishes one Chafin Dish and one Looking Glasse one hour Glasse and one pewter bottle and one Lanthorn my wearing Coats I give to be Equally Dvided between my four Daughters as they shall Think fit and convenient I give to Ann the wife of Augustin Kunnicut one brass Kettle about three Gallons & a pair of Sheats and to her Daughter Martha one ring with a Stone in it the remainder of my Estate not here given my Debts being paid I give to my Son Augustin Kunnicut and appoint my Son Augustin Kunnicut my sole and sole Executor of this my Last Will & Testament In Witnes my hand to Seal this Twentieth Third Day of August one Thousand seven hundred and Seventeen

This Indenture made this fourteenth Day of July in the fourth year of the Reigne of our Sovereign Lord King George of Great Brittain France and Ireland and in the year of our Lord God one Thousand seven hundred and Eighteen Between Joseph Wall of Surry County of the one part and James Wall of the aforesaid County of the other Part Witnesseth that the said Joseph Wall for and in Consideration of five shillings Sterling to him in hand paid by the said James Wall whereof he hath hereby Acknowledged the Receipt, hath bargained and sold and sold by These presents bargain and sell unto the said James Wall his Executors or Administrators one Tract or parcel of Land in Surry County Containing one Hundred Acres be the Same more or Less Situate lying and being on the South Side the main blackwater Swamp and bounded as followeth; begining at a marked red oak Sapling on the West Side of a branch Commonly Called the Indian field branch and so by a Line of marked Trees to the upper Line of the whole Tract and a long the said Line to Thomas Wallers Line & thence by Thomas Wallers Line to the said branch and so along the Runn of the said branch to the first Station. To have and To hold, and to hold the said Land and premises to the appurtenances unto the said James Wall his Executors & Administrators from the Day next before the Date hereof unto the End and Term of one Year from Thence next ensuing and fully to be Completed & Ended and it is hereby Declared that these presents are soe made and Accepted that hereby and by Virtue & force of the Statute made in the Seven and Twentieth Year of the Reigne of King Henry the Eighth for the Transferring of Uses into possession he the said James Wall may be in Actuell Possession of the said Land and premises and be Enabled to Take and Accept of a Grant & Release of the Reversion and Inheritance of the Same Land and premises to him and his Heirs to the use of him and his Heirs and Assigns for ever In Witness whereof the said Joseph Wall hath hereunto set his hand and Seal the Day and Year above written
