In the name of God Amen I Mary Cotten of the Parish of Southwark in the County of Surry being sick and weak in body but of sound Perfect & disposing mind and memory Praide be given to God for the same & knowing the Uncertainty of this life on Earth being desirous to settle things in Order do make this my Last Will and Testament in manner & form following that is to say First and principally I command my soul to Almighty God my Creator & surely believing that I shall receive full pardon & free Remission of all my Sins & bewrayed by the Precious Death & Merits of my blessed Saviour & Mediator Christ Jesus & my body to the Earth from whence it was taken to be buried in such decent & Christian manner as to my Executor hereafter named Shall be thought meet & convenient and as touching such Mortal Estate as the Lord in mercy hath lent me my Will & meaning is the same shall be Employed and bestowed as hereafter by this my Will is Expressed and first I revoke and make void all Wills by me formerly made and declare and Appoint this my last Will and Testament —

I Will that my debts & funeral charges shall be paid & discharged —

Item I devise unto my Grandson David slide One Round Table with a Drawer in it & four Chairs, a huccaback Table cloth, Five huccaback Napkins, a Diaper Napkin, a Large Pewter Dish, A Pewter Tankard, two new Plates, a great church Bible, a common Prayer book of his Fathers, a book call'd the Youth's Guide —

Item I devise unto my granddaughter Mary Cotten One Iron Pott and Pothooks, Pot back, a Ten gallon kettle a feather bed and bolster Rugg, and blanket a pair of Cotton Sheets A Wenscot bedstead and Cord, a Pewter dish two Pewter basons a Pewter Chamber Pott, a Small Chest with lock

Item and key, a Spinning Wheel, a Bible of Eighteen Shillings Price
 I give unto my Son Thomas Cotton and my Daughter Jane Cotton all the Remainder of my Estate and
 I do hereby Appoint my Son Thomas Cotton Sole Executor of this my Last Will and Testament In
 Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this Seventh day of March
 in the Year of Our Lord One thousand Seven hundred Twenty eight and Nine

This Indenture Made the Thirteenth day of January In the Year of Our Lord One thousand
 Seven hundred and twenty eight Between William Kymball of the County of Brunswick of the
 One Part and Joseph Kymball of the County of Surry of the other Part Wittenesseth that the said Willm.
 Kymball for and in consideration of the sum of five Shillings to him in hand paid the Receipt
 whereof he doth hereby Acknowledge and thereof doth Recquit and discharge the said Joseph Kymball
 his Executors Adam & Augustus Heath bargained and sold and doth by these presents bargain
 and sell unto the said Joseph Kymball his Executors Adam & Augustus a certain Tract or Parcell
 of Land with the Appurtenances therof Situate lying and being on the south side of the little brook
 of the three Creeks in the County of Surry aforesaid containing by Estimate two hundred Acres of Land
 to be the same more or less, the same being Part of a Pallen for three hundred & Twenty five Acres
 of Land granted to the said William Kymball the Twenty second day of February One thousand
 Seven hundred and twenty four, and is bounded as followeth Viz Beginning at a Mark Tree by
 the side of the little Creek aforesaid a corner of James Vaughans land thence by Vaughans lines
 the back lines of the said Pallen and a line of Mark Trees agreed upon for a dividing line betwixt
 Ralph Jackson and the said Joseph Kymball to a Mark white Oak by the side of the West fork of
 the Bloody Ford branch and down the various courses of the run of the said branch and of the little
 Creek to the begining and also the Reversion and Reversions remainder and remainders therof to
 have and to hold the aforesaid Land with its Appurtenances unto the said Joseph Kymball
 his Executors Administrators & Assigns from the day next before the date hereof unto the end & term
 and for and during the term of one year from thence next ensuing to the intent that by virtue whereof
 and of the Statute for Transferring uses into Possession the said Joseph Kymball may be in the sole
 possession of the said Land and be enabled to take and accept of a grant and release of the Prom-
 ises to him his heirs and Assigns for ever In Witteness whereof the said William Kymball hath
 herunto
