This Indenture made this fifteen day of October in the Year of our Lord God One Thousand Seven hundred twenty One Between Mathew Smart of the parish of Merchant Brass one in the County of Prince George of the one part and William Wollice of the same Parish & County of the other part Witnesseth That the said Mathew Smart for and in Consideration of ten pounds of Lawfull money to him in hand paid by the said William Wollice at and before the sealing and Delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Mathew Smart doth hereby acknowledge and himself to be therewith fully satisfied Contented and paid and thereof doth Acquit and Discharge the said William Wollice his heirs Ex<sup>d</sup> &c. Hath given granted bargained Sold remised released and for Ever Quitted Claim And by these presents the said Mathew Smart doth for himself his heirs Ex<sup>d</sup> &c Give Grant Bargain sell remise release and for Ever quit Claim unto the said W<sup>m</sup> Wollice and to his heirs for Ever to all that Seat Tract or Parcell of Land with the Appurtenances in the County of Surry lying and being on the South side of Matherin River containing two hundred Acres of Land and beginning at three small mulberry Trees upon the River side thence South three Degrees West one hundred and sixteen pole to a hickory thence South fifteen Degrees East One hundred & three pole to a red Oak thence North ninety degrees East One hundred and twenty six pole to three Trees chapt inwards then North eighteen degrees West two hundred and sixty four pole to an Ash by the side of Matherin River aforesaid just below the mouth of a small branch and up the severall Courses of the said River to the beginning To have and to hold the said two hundred Acres of Land unto the said William Wollice and his heirs and Assigns for Ever together with all houses Orchards Gardens Woods Underwoods Ways Pastures Feedings and all Waters and Water Courses thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining so that neither the said Mathew Smart nor his heirs nor any claiming or to claim by from or under him or them shall not at any time hereafter have any Right Title Intrust Claim or Demand of in or to the said two hundred Acres of Land with the Appurtenances hereby granted but that the same shall be and for Ever hereafter Enure to the only sole proper use and behoof of him the said William Wollice and his heirs and Assigns for Ever And the said Mathew Smart doth hereby further promise and Agree to and with the said William Wollice that he the said Mathew Smart and his heirs Ex<sup>d</sup> &c shall and will warrant and Defend this present bargain and Sale (by a Generall Warranty) against all and all persons whatsoever unto him the said William Wollice and to his heirs and Assigns for Ever In Witness whereof the said Mathew Smart hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his Seal y<sup>e</sup> day and year above written
