In the Name of God Amen December the nineteenth in the Year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and twentyeth I Morris Callham of the County of Surry being in health of body and of good & perfect memory thanks be to God do make this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following viz: First I bequeath my Soul and Spirit unto the hands of Almighty God my Heavenly Father by whom of his meer and only Grace I trust to be saved through the death of my Saviour and Redeemer Jesus Christ in whose precious blood the whole and only hope of my Resurrection I Commit my body to the Earth to be buried with such Charge and in such place as my Dear wife and my other ex^{rs} hereafter named shall think good and touching the distribution of my mortall goods I dispose of the same as followeth first I will that all such Debts as I owe shall be truly pay

I Give to my daughter Frances Callham nine hogs at three years old and two Sows and pigs and two heffers at three Years old two Steers two years old and one little pot and a dish and a pail one mare at three Years old one mare at two year old

I Give to my Loving wife Frances Callham all the rest of my hould Estate

I make my wife to be my executrix and my brother Nicholas Callham to be Executors

This Indenture made the Seventeenth day of October in the Eighth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George King of Great Britain France and Ireland and in the Year of our Lord God One thousand Seven hundred and twenty one Between John Stuard of North Carolina of the one part and Richard Blow of Surry County in Virginia of the other part Witnesseth that the said John Stuard for and in Consideration of five Shillings to him on hand paid by the said Richard Blow whereof he doth hereby acknowledge the receipt hath bargained and sold and hath by these presents bargain and sell unto the said Richard Blow his Executors and Administrators one tract or parcell of Land in Surry County containing by Estimation eighty Acres more or less Situate lying and being on on the South side of the main black water Swamp and bounded as followeth beginning on the mouth of a small branch called hog pen neck branch on the South side Secock swamp and so down the Swamp to a line of markt trees so along that line to the corner Tree thence on the side line to the aforesaid branch so down the branch to the fourth Station To Have and to hold the said Land and premises with the Appurtenances unto the said Richard Blow his Executors and Administrators from the day next before the date hereof unto the end and term of one year from thence next ensuing and fully to be compleated and ended and it is hereby declared that these presents are so made and accepted that hereby and by Vertue and force of the Statute made in the Seven and twentieth Year of the reign of King Henry the Eighth for the Transferring of uses into possession he the said Richard Blow may be in actuall possession of the said Land and premises and be enabled to take and accept of a Grant and Release of the Reversion and Inheritance of the same Land and premises to him and his heirs to the use of him & his heirs and Assignes for ever In Witness whereof the said John Stuard have hereto set his hand and Seal the day and year above written
