I Give to my Son Nicholas five Shillings Current Money of Virginia

I Give to my daughter Anne Half a Crown Current Money of Virginia

I Give to my daughter Mary five Shillings Current Money of Virginia

I Give to my Son John One third part of all the remaining part of my Estate after the said Legacies, and all my just Debts are paid

I Give to my Loving Wife Eleanor all the remaining part of my Estate not before disposed of and do hereby Caskhule and appoint her to be Sole executrix of this my last Will and Testam. and do hereby revoke and make void all other Wills by me heretofore made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this fourth day of August in the Year of our Lord Christ, 1723.

My further Will is, that my Loving Wife Eleanor do Appraise and Sell the said Estate and my Negroes Dick, Rebe, and Will be Sold and the Money accruing to my Wife Eleanor upon the said Sale to be first apply'd to pay my Debts being just and then the said Legacies and the Remainder of all my Estate I give to my Loving Wife to be by her Disposed of at her Will and pleasure.
