perfect List or Rent role of the same to his Majties. Auditor of this County upon Oath at such times

his Majties Revenues & Dues in the s^d County during the time of his Shrievalty and also that he shall
due payment make of all such publick Dues as shall be Levied in the afores^d County of Surry unto
the Ser^{ts} persons as shall be appointed to receive the same and full performances make of all
