I Robert Hart of the County of Surry being very weak of body but of sound and perfect mind & memory thanks be therefore given to Almighty God do make Ordain and appoint this my present Last Will & Testament in manner and form following That is to say First and princely I Give my Soul to

Item I Give and bequeath to my son William all my Land and plantations within the main black water Swamp excepting one and my Negro Girl Frank and her increase only her first Child that lives to my Grandson Robert Hart and my Negro woman Judy and my Negro man Peter & my Will is that my Son William shall bring up my Son Thomas to as much Learning as he has himself for the aforesaid Negro Peter and I Give him half a Dozen of bottles, and two stone jugs, & one fifth part of what linen and woollen I now have in my house.

Item I Give and bequeath to my Son Robert all my Land and Plantations on the other side of middle branch in the Isle of Wight County and a Negro Youth called Robin and my best brass kettle & one doz. of bottles, and one stone jug, and sixty yards of brown Ozen brigs, & if my Son Robert have not heirs of his own body then my Will is that the Land and Negro return to his youngest brother.

Item I Give to my Daughter Ann one piece of Dowlas between twenty and thirty Ells and to each of her Sons a Cow and Calf and to my said Daughter Ann my Negro Girl Betty & one Doz. of bottles.

Item I Give to my Daughter Elizabeth twenty five pounds Curr^t money of Virginia to buy her a young Negro and all the Cattle on my plantation that is commonly called or known by the name of hers and her Choice of the Iron pots, and Fryng pans & one doz. of bottles, & one stone jug, & one new Jar.

Item I Give to my Daughter Sarah one Negro Girl called Judy to her & y^e heirs of her body & for want of such heirs I Give her between her two Younger sisters and all the Cattle on this plantations that is called or known by the name of hers and one new rug, & one blanket, and 50 of holland sheets, & one Iron pot, & Fryng pan, & four pewter dishes, four plates, & four porringers, & one Jarhead & one p. of stuff & nine Ells of Dowlas, & one doz. of bottles, & my black horse & Womans saddle.

Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary one Negro Girl called Hannah.

Item I Give to my Daughter Priscilla one Negro Girl called Pat.

Item I Give & bequeath to my Son Thomas one Negro Girl called Moll & her increase & my Plantation. I now live on wth all the Land belonging to it in the County of Surry & my plantations on the other side the main Swamp whereon Rich^d Miret now dwells being bounded wth the spring branch and Gaultneys line and the main swamp & one new bed and furniture & my Sile to be equally between him and my Grandson Robert Hart & my Will is that my Son Thomas have Ten pounds Currant money paid him at the age of Eighteen as also his whole Estate and be for himself at his own dispose. And my Will is that my two Daughters Mary, and Priscilla have the benefit of there Labour at sixteen and their Estates at Eighteen years of age.

Item I Give to Priscilla my well beloved wife the Labour of my Negro woman Betty during her natural

278. life and the bed she lies on with the furniture belonging to it and after the Death of my wife my Will is that the Negro woman Betty be equally between my two Sons Will^m & Thomas & all of rest of my Estate Goods and Chattles my Will is that it is equally divided between my wife & my three youngest Children. And I do appoint my Son William Hart my whole & sole Executor of this my Last Will and Testam^t and I do hereby make Void & rescind all other Will by me made heretofore.
