I give to my Loving Wife Phillis all the rest of my Estate be it in what Nature or Quality Whatsoever after my just debts are paid during her Natural life.

I doo Appoint my Loving Wife Phillis and Nich: Magel my Joynt Ex^{ors} and Executor of this my Last Will Revoking all former Wills unto which I have hereunto sett my hand and Seale this 28th day of April 1728

In the name of God Amen The Last Will and Testament of Robert Andrus being in perfect Sense and memory thanks be to Almighty God for it this 18th day of February 1728: First I give and bequeave my Soul to Almighty God in hopes of a glorious Resurrection to Eternal life & my body to be Decently bourn to the Grave and buried and as for all my worldly goods that God of his great Mercy hath bestowed upon me thus I them bestow as followeth. (Viz.)

1. I give and bequeave to my Son Joseph Andrus a certain tract of Land lying on Cyprus Swamp and bounded one the great branch which is the Dividing line between my Land and my brother Thomas Andrus Land and one the other side one a branch called the Little branch and so up to the head line to him and the heirs of his own body lawfully begotten for ever and also his part of my Estate which he hath already received.

2. I give and bequeave to my Son William Andrus his part of my Estate which he hath already received.

3. I give and bequeave to my Son Bartholomew Andrus two Shillings.

4. I give and bequeave to my Son Benjamin Andrus my plantation whereon I now live and the Land thereunto belonging and one hundred and seventy Acres adjoining to the said plantation to him & the heirs of his own body lawfully begotten for ever and also a young horse which I have already put in his possession and a third part of my cattle hogs and sheep and a feather bed which is my second best bed and the furniture which is thereunto belonging and one Iron Stoll about three or four gallons and two good pewter dishes and a Chest which I commonly used my self & one gun. I give and bequeave to my Daughter Susanna Ray her part of my Estate which she hath already

 9. I Give and bequeave to my Daughter Elizabeth Little her part of my Estate which she hath already Received.
 10. I Give and bequeave to my Daughter Anne one cow and calf.
 11. I Give and bequeave to my loving Wife one feather bed whereon I usually lie and the furniture thereunto belonging during her life and after her death to my Daughter Anne.
 12. I Give and bequeave all the rest of my Personall Estate whatever, my Lawfull Debts being first paid to be Equally Divided to my loving Wife and her four Children (viz.) Hannah, Susanna, Sarah and Anne and do make my loving Wife whole & sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament as Witness my hand and seal the day and year first above Writne.
