Riggan

The former Guardian Jeph Carter has hired out the negroes for the present year and says he has contracted for this years board of the Orphan and for the support of Cate and children, these hires which are due on the first day of January 1827, amount to the sum of \$125, half of which \$62.50 to the Orphan Sarah Riggan from which deduct a Commission of 6 per cent leaves \$58.50, and to pay for her board & clothing \$450, and for the support of Cate & children \$12.50 makes a deficit of \$4 for her support the present year. No account of the administration of Richard O. Riggan's estate having been returned to the Court, any balance to be distributed that may be due thereon remains to appear hereafter to the credit of the Orphan Mrs. H. 





The late Guardian Elizabeth Adams having hired out the negroes for the present year the account has been continued to the first day of January next 1828 when those hires will fall due the land belonging to the Orphan is represented to have been put up for rent to the highest bidder but no tenant could be got for it nor could the late Guardian obtain rent for it by private contract nothing is therefore allowed for rent this year.

I find a balance due the Orphan on the first day of January one thousand eight hundred & twenty eight from his late Guardian Elizabeth Adams of sixty three dollars and ninety four cents, which sum accrued as interest. respectfully submitted.
