executors, administrators, jointly, and severally, firmly
by these presents wth the J^r: Mason, and Seales, Dated the fift
day of february Anno Dom: 1682

Whereas the above named J^r: Spilthorpe at the instance
and persuasion of the above bound Thomas Warringe and
for his proper engaging, by thire bond, and obligation standeth
bound unto the governor, and Council of Virg^a for the J^r:
Warringe his true, full, and just performance of a Commission
of Administration granted unto him the J^r: Warringe
for the freitie goods, chattels, Chancells, and Estate of J^r: Good
Planter on the behalfe of many Perrell w^{ch} the orphan
Under the tuition of him the J^r: Warringe, as by the
Bond, or obligation, Remainings in the Sec^{re}ts office
in James City in Virg^a Relation being therunto had more
at large may appere.

And the condition of this obligation is such that
if the above bound Thomas Warringe his heires, executors,
and administrators doe from time to time, and all all times
hereafter well, and truly, performe the tenor of the
Commission of Administration, and that in all matters, and
places, according to the purpose, true meaning, and effect of
the aforesaid obligation, and condition.

And further if that hee the above bound Thomas
Warringe his heires, executors, and administrators doe
from time to time, and all all times hereafter well, and
justly, save, and keepe harmless, and undamprifye the
J^r: Spilthorpe his heires, executors, and administrators, goods,
chattels, Chancells, lands, tenements, and hereditaments, and every pt^l and
spec^l: of them, and every of them, of and from all and
manner of Actions, and Actions, Sutes, Charges, Damages, Losses,
and Circumstances whatsoever, that shall or may happen
unto him or them, for or concerning the non performance
of the aforesaid Commission of Administration, or bond thereto
or: That then this present obligation shall be void
and of none effect, or else to stand, and remaine in full
force, power, and vertue
