 of our Lord God 1682 I Arthur Jordan of Southwark parish in Surrey County being
 very sick and weak of body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given to
 God I doe make and bequeath this my last will and testament in manner and forme
 following that is to say First and chiefly I give my soul into the hands of Almighty
 God who gave it mee, And my body I commend to the earth to be decently buried
 in Christian buriall at the discretion of my Executor, nothing doubting but of the
 generall resurrection I shall receive the same againe by the mighty power of God.
 As touching my worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless mee I give
 devise bequeath and dispose the same in manner and forme following

Item I give and bequeath unto my son George Jordan all the land that I now possess
 as also a Negroe boy that now lives with him by name George and a good feather
 bed with a rugge and a blanket.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son David Jordan one good feather bed with a
 rugge and a blanket, A negroe boy that now lives with him by name William
 and one Malatto boy by name John and a Negroe girl by name Sarah

Item I give and bequeath unto my son and daughter Washington one good feather
 bed a rugge a paire of Blanketts and a paire of sheets one bay mare called
 Skilloe one Negroe girl that already lives with them by name Teabro, and a Negro
 boy that lives with them likewise by name Sam.

Item I give unto my granddaughter Elizabeth Jordan one red p^gd cow called named
 Dagge

Item I give and bequeath unto my grandson Arthur Washington one black p^gd
 cow named Spot

Item I give and bequeath all my other estate being in Virginia or elsewhere
 unto my two sonnes George and David Jordan to be equally divided between them
 share and share alike

I doe also will and carnally desire that my Negro woman Charity be and doe
 immediately after my decease quietly possesse and enjoy her freedom And whereas there
 being a late act of Assembly that the obliges all Negroes enjoying their freedom
 to be transported out of this Country before they can have here at doe therefore
 command and oblige you George and David Jordan as y^e are aforementioned that
 you at your owne proper cost and charges to send her out of this Country and to
 bringt her in againe and suffer her peaceably to enjoy her freedom as aforesaid

I do acquit and discharge the abovesaid John Warrend his heirs &c
And for ever have granted bargained sold aliened conveyed and confirmed
and by this present writing do fully absolutely for ever my heirs &c
and assigns with the free consent of my wife Elizabeth my wife grant
bargain and sell and alien convey and confirm unto the abovesaid John
Warrend a certain piece of Land situate lying and being in the
County of Surry about the head of upper Chippinck creek containing
rightly more or less from the abovesaid Thomas Adkins to John
Warrend his heirs or assigns for ever beginning at a mark oak
standing in the County Line there along the said Line till it come to
a mark pine tree thence to a Spring branch and so along the branch
till it come to the first station according to the Survey which was made
