In the name of god Amen I Edward Grantham being weak and sick  
in body but in effect senses and memory doe make and appoynt this  
my last will & Testament as followeth first I bequeath my soule to  
god that gave it me in hopes y<sup>e</sup> through y<sup>e</sup> merits of Iesus Christ I  
shall be raised att y<sup>e</sup> last day to life Evermall. And for my small Estate  
w<sup>ch</sup> it hath pleased God to Endow me withall I doe dispose of as followeth  
I Give and bequeath unto my son Edward Grantham my plantation  
with one hundred acres of Land thereto belonging beginning att the  
Swamp upon the Dariesse line soo up the Swamp and up y<sup>e</sup> Dariesse  
line to y<sup>e</sup> head line untill it make up the above said hundred acres of Land  
to him y<sup>e</sup> to Edward Grantham and the heyres of his body for Ever  
I Give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Grantham and the heyres  
of his body lawfully begotten one hundred acres of Land Joyning upon  
my son Edward beginning att y<sup>e</sup> Swamp and soe out to y<sup>e</sup> head  
line in strait course

Item I Give and bequeath unto my sonne John Grantham and his heirs of the  
body lawfull begotten all the rest of my lands in Virginia for ever

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Grantham one shilling  
in whole for her Estate -

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Joane Grantham the bed Iron  
lis upon with Colster Rugg and Blanchers bedstoods and Cord the Rest  
of my Estate which I have not already disposed of I Give and bequeath  
unto my loving wife Elizabeth Grantham and my five children to be  
Equally divided amongst them after my Just debts be paid to wit  
John Grantham Joane Grantham Edward Grantham Thomas Grantham  
and Elonor Grantham -

Further I doo nominate and appoynt my loving wife Eliz. Grantham my sole  
Executricks to see this my will performed which I Acknowledge to be my  
last will and testament whers unto I have set my hand and seals  
this first day of may 1700
