Corra Record. To the Court

I Francis Mason being Sick & weak in Body but of sound & disposing mind & memory all said & Prays & gives to Almighty God therefore do make and ordains this my last Will & Testament in manner following (viz)

First & Principally & first about all Earthly things & enjoyments I commit my soul to God y^e Father of spirits trusting and firmly believing thro' y^e merits better Passion of my alone Saviour & Redeemer Jesus Christ to receive full Pardon & remission of all my sins when ever this Mortall life shall cease, and for what worldly & Estate it hath pleased y^e Lord to bestow upon me after my debts and funerrall charges is pay'd I give & bequeath & dispose of as followeth

Item I give & bequeath to my son James Mason and to his heirs for ever y^e one halfe of my D^evidend of three hundred acres of Land formerly, belonging to John Bushup late of this County, & void to be layd off from the North North East End thereof & the other halfe

my said Dividend of Land I give & bequeath to
Daughter Frances Mott and to her heirs for ever
and farther Give to my afores^d Son James my negr
man Tony my Malatto boy Jack & my negr girl Betty
together with two bedsteads two feather beds & furniture
& two pairs of sheets & a new silver tankard to be bought
by my Ex^{or}: hereafter named of eight pound price
my silver salt & six new silver spoons my Round
Dinner table a diaper table cloth & a doz: of diaper
napkins a doz: of new leather chairs my copper kettle
& two Iron pots & pot hooks a doz: of pewter dishes
a doz: of pewter plates: ten head of cattle nine of them
now running at y^e Plantacon & one cow at my son Halls
in Hoggland as also what stock of hogs is at y^e P^l planti-
tion except the English breed out of which he is only
to have one sow and I also farther give my s^d son
my Pistols & houlsters & Cymiter two brace of pistols
two chamber pots & a pair of andirons & four good
bits of tob^o.

It. I also farther give my said son after my wife's decease
to him & to his heirs for ever all my plantacon tract
or dividend of Land whereon I now live and I also
give my s^d Son at y^e decease of my said wife my
negr Tom old Moll & her Daughter of y^e Name my
said wife having the use of them & benefit of their
labor during her life.

It. I give to my Daughter Frances y^e wife of Tho Mott my
negro man Will & my Mollatto girl Jack together with
ten head of cattle by me lately purchased of W^m Cowland
one feather bed & furniture & new canvas to make a
pair of sheets my new silver Tankard two new sil-
ver spoons & my bay horse fox, and I farther give to
my

half of my Deceased of three hundred acres of land
formerly belonging to John Bishop to be layd off
 $\frac{1}{2}$ South both west and there of & I further give my Said
Daughter Six New chairs

It. I Give & Bequeath to my son in law Tho: Holt my
New Stuff sute my New hat a pair of worsted hose my
Guns my own saddle and bridles gun.

It. I Give & Bequeath to my Grand daughter Eliza Holt
my Negro girl Sarah and all her Increase.

It. I Give to my Grand Daughter lately borne being
the youngest child of my Daughter Holt my
Negro boy called Frank.

It. I Give and Bequeath to my young friends Mr.
Will Edwards Arthur Allen Thomas Burns Mr. Edw:
Counfield & Mr. Mary White to each of them twenty
shillings to buy 'em a Ring.

It. It is my Will and desire y^t Fra: Price orphan as
maime with my wife till he come to age & y^t then
Sho my S^r Wife pay and deliver to him two cows
& calves & two sutes of apparel & y^t he be traind up
and Improv'd in his reading & writing.

It. It is my will & desire y^t Will y^t son & orphan of Rich:
Jolkes live and continue with my son in law
Thomas Holt from & immediately after my decease
till he comes to age & y^t he use his Care & indus-
try to keep him to, & to improve him in his
Reading & writing & pay him what belongs
to him of his fathers Estate

It. I Give and Bequeath to my young Wife Eliza four
during her natural life all y^t my Plantation
tract or Deed of Land whereon I now live & from
& immediately after her decease I Give and Bequeath

the said land to my son James Mason & his heirs.
And it is also my Will & desire of my Negro man &
Negro woman Moll & her Daughter of the same
continue & remain with my Wif^e so long as
and in deede after her decease, I give and be-
my said three Slaves to my son James. And
further Will and desire, And I hereby Give & be-
to my said Wif^e after my debts & generall Exp^{ts}
Legacies are paid, all the rest & remaind^r of
Estate of what Nature Kind Property or Qual-
soever it be And I hereby make my said wif^e
Ex^{ec} of this my last will and Testam^t. In Test^e
of all which I have herunto set my hand
the 9th day of 9th 1696
