 pounds of of to be In Cash In hand recd with which we acknowledge our selves  
 fully contented and paid have bargained sold delivered and do by these presents for our  
 heirs Exors<sup>r</sup> and adminy<sup>r</sup> for ever bargain sold and deliver In feoff and for ever  
 unto Elias Fort of Southwark p<sup>th</sup> In the County of Surry and to his heirs Exors<sup>r</sup>  
 adms<sup>r</sup> and assigns for ever one hundred and fifty acres of Land be the same more or less  
 lying and being In the p<sup>th</sup> and County aforesaid on the South Side of Tomleson  
 Swamp beginning at a white oak thence South west by west to a road oak a former Tree  
 then thence East by South to a Hoop of gum In a branch called the bystock branch then  
 the track to the Swamp so up the same to the first Station the said Land being part  
 of Eighteen hundred and fifty acres granted to Captain W<sup>m</sup> Cocher as by p<sup>th</sup> appear  
 and being purchased by me of W<sup>m</sup> Ross and Lucy his wife as by a deed Indented may  
 appear to have and to hold the said one hundred and fifty acres of Land be the same  
 more or less with all houseing orched fencings thereons or there to belonging an  
 all priviledges of hawking hunting fishing and fowling to him the said Elias Fort  
 his heirs Exors<sup>r</sup> and assigns for ever In as full and ample manner to all intents and  
 purposes as the most Lorned In the Law can devise and woe hereby bind our selves our  
 heirs Exors<sup>r</sup> and administrators to warrant and defend this our Sales of all and singular  
 the premises with there appertinences to him the said Elias Fort his heirs Exors<sup>r</sup> and  
 assigns for ever against all and all manner of persons what so ever and to give the said Elias  
 Fort Livery and Seison of the same and what farther Lawfull actions as shall by his or  
 there Lorned Counsell be thought fitt and to acknowlege this to be our real act and deed  
 In the next Court to be hold for the County aforesaid In witness of the premises we
