I Hm I giue and Bequeath unto my Louing sonn Bray Hargraue my Longest gunn &c

I Hm I giue and Bequeath unto my Louing sonn Samuell Hargraue my Short Gunn &c

I Hm my Will and Desier is Thatt all my Working Toolis bee Equally Deuided Betwene my two Sonns Bray and Lemuell &c

I Hm I nominate Constetute and Appoynt my Louing friend Sam^r Thompson Exeq^r of This my Last Will and Testemen and Doe hear by make null and uoide All former Wills by me made In witness Whereof I haue hear unto Telt my hand and Seale This 19th of may 1704

 Ifm I Give to my daughter Elizabeth Jones one beas & furniture that stands at the nor west door now
 Ifm I Give to my sonn Thomas Two thousand & sixty pds of tobacco to be paid when he shall come to the Age of one and twenty years old
 Ifm I Give to my daughter Ann at John Jagers one gilt bible which was her mothers I Give and bequise unto my loueing Wife feoray and her children all The Rest of my Estate both within and with out be in what condition soe ever and whole and sole Execitrix of all & this my Last Will as Witness my hand & Seill

This Indenture made the fourth day of September in the third year of the Reigne of our Soueraign Lady Anne of England Scotland France and Ireland Queen Defensor of the Faith &c and in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and four Betwixen John Scott and Thomas Harrison both of the County of Prince George of the one Parts and Sayal Lowe of the same County Widow of the other parts Witnesseth that whereas the said John Scott and Thomas Harrison by one Writing under their hands and Seales Dated the first day of April 1701 did sell assigne and make over unto Micajah Lowe late the Husband of the said
