 Francis mason my full & hole Exor. of this my last
 will and Testament and that immediately after my
 decease my son Wm go with my Exor. by him to be
 disposed until he come to the age of one & twenty
 years but if in case my son should dye before he come to
 the years of one & twenty then I give and bequeath all my
 Estate aforesaid to Mr Francis Mason In Witness whereof
 I have hereunto put my hand and Seal this 31st January

the time of the enfolding & delivery of the assents -

done in any manner howsoever In witness whereof the
