my last will and testament in manner and forme following that is to say first
and principally I committe my soul to Almighty God my Creator absurdly
believing that I shall receave full pardon and full triumphe of all my sinnes
and be saved by the precious death and merits of my blessed Saviour
and redeemer Christ Jesus and my body to the earth from whence it was taken
and so bee buried in such decent and Christian maner as to my Exting hys
after named shall be thought meet and convenient and as touching such worldly
things as the Lord in mercy hath sent me my will and menting is the same
that hee employed and bestowed as hereafter by this my will is expressed And
first I doe reveake and renounce fraude and make void all wills by me
formerly made and declared and appoint this my last will to stand.

Item I have given unto my son Richard what lands and estate I have
to bestow on him after my death a building sow hee being in possession of the
said land in my life time

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Charly a part of land w^{ch} was
Formerly Mr. Owings being part of the tract of land wher I now live -
on being divided by a row of marsh trees the lower part of the same and
the lawfull heirs of his body for ever, & here with I give him all my
working tools.

Item I give unto my son Robt the plantation and land I do now live
on that is to say the upper part of that land after the death of my wife -
to him and his lawfull heirs of his body for ever; and my will and menting
is that if either of my sons die Charles or Robt shall dye without
leaving his land I shall give to the longest heire and if it shall not happen
they both dye without issue the said land to be equally divided between
my three yongest daughters or the longest heire of the three to them and
their heires.

Item I do give unto my daughter Elizabeth one ewe and lamb and two
wheats one linne wheth and one woollen wheth

Item I give unto my daughter Elizabeth Post one breeding sow

Item I give unto my daughter Margaret Howse one breeding sow

Item I give unto my daughter Hannah one ewe and lamb

Item I give unto my daughter Mary one ewe and lamb

Item I give unto my daughter Sarah one ewe and lamb

And my will is that after my three youngest daughters have the tenth day
shall attain the age of sixteen and my will and desire is that her marriage of these
daughters shall run until my daughters attain the age of eight years.

Item I do make and ordain my loving wife my whole estate of this my last
will and testament and do give unto my said wife all my goods and chattels with all
other of my effects not already given and bequeathed paying and discharging all my
just debts, And my will is that my wife shall enjoy my plantation during her
natural life; And my will and meaning is that there shall not be any waste made by
settling of any member of off the land but that he or she and his or her children shall keep in a
good repair and the Orchard to be kept within a sufficient fence, And likewise
my will is that my son Charles shall have all and worth for his mother until he
shall attain the age of twenty years, and then to be possessed of the aforesaid land
which is given him but if my wife die before this my will is that she shall enjoy the
land given him at my wife's death, And my will is that my son Robert shall have all
and worth for his mother until he shall attain the age of eighteen years and if it
shall happen that my wife shall die before my desire is that my son Rob: may be
placed out until the age of sixteen years, And my will is that the rest of my plantation
may be employed to the maintenance of my three youngest daughters until my son Rob:
shall attain the age of one and twenty years.

Whereas His General Assembly began at Jamey City on 27th April last & prorogued to the 8th day of May next and on advice in Council found it most for the Matrix and these Colonies secure that the Assembly be prorogued until further time Therefore I George ~
V King of Great Britain and Governor General of Eng: by virtue of the powe-
and authority to me given by His Matrix letters patents under the great seal
of England bearing date at Wmftn the 20th day of July in the tenth year
of His reign do by this proclamation in His Matrix name publish and declare
that I have prorogued the said Assembly and it is hereby prorogued to the 31st
day of July next And which time I do hereby require every representative member
that they fail not in giving their attendance accordingly Given under my hand and
the Seal of the Colony the 6th day of April anno Domini 1700

age of. eighteen yeare or bee married and in case of the death of my child
before it bee possessed of this land then my will is that my wife enjoy the
said land for the time of. her naturall life p in case my child doe dye in its
minoritie then after my wifes decease I doe give and bequeath unto George Jordan
the son of George Jordan my plantation I now live upon with all his
adjoyning and belonging thereto p my will is that hee bee possessor the same
after my wifes decease

I doe just and bequeath unto Arthur Jordan son of George Jordan one neck -
of land joyning to his said fathir land and soth up the swamp to branch talked
the Spring branch containing the breadth of my hand *

I doe just and bequeath unto Thomas Jordan son of George Jordan the
broken neck of land joyning to John Puckett his plantation & the I plantation
I doe just and bequeath unto my Mabette boy named William desiring that
he bee not appraised into my wifes estate my child doe attaine unto the age of. twenty
and one yeare p then I doe give him to my Child but in case my Child doe
dye before it bee attaine to the age of. twenty p one yeare then my will is
that the said boy bee set free the remant of. his naturall life and then my
will is that hee bee free

I doe just and bequeath unto William Brown son of William Brown just one
roffe of a yeare old.

I doe give and bequeath all the rest of my estate after my just debts are payd
to bee equally divided between my deare and loving wife priscilla and my Child
that shee is now with child with bee it male or female the Child to receve its
part from the mother (if it bee a son) when it shall attaine to the age of

Twenty and one yeare: if it be a daughter when she shall attaine to the age of eighteen yeares or bee married; but in case my Child should die before it doth attaine to the age here allotted to receive its part of my estate then my will is that my wife doe enjoy my child's part, & in case my wife doe first die my Child afterwards before it doth attaine to the age here allotted to receive its part of my estate then my will is that George Washington bee payed ten shillings out of my Child's part and that the rest bee equally divided between ^{Mary} Elizabeth Jordan daughter of George Jordan and I do appoint my deare and loyting wife priscilla Jordan my hooke and sole Executrix of this my last will and testament freely revoking all other wills In witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and seal this 2^d day of Dec^r 1699
