I give and bequeath unto Hannah Richerill my well beloved wife all my hole Estate in Generall to her & her assignes and doe Consiluto & ordain Hannah my well beloved wife my hole and soul &c &c is too this my last will & testam^t truly performed in witness whereunto I have set my hand and seal this day and year above written

 will and desire is that if my loving wife Remains a Widow that she
 shall have Every p^t and p^{ro} of all kinds what soe^r in and out her
 disposing Except one Cow and one Kipper of four year old and one yearling
 which belongeth to my daughter Sarah but my wife Charis & all my will-
 and desire is that what Estate I have should be Equally divided betwix
 her and all my Children but as long as she keeps a widow I give all and
 Every p^t and p^{ro} unto my loving wife Charis whom I make my sole
 Ex^{ec} of this my last will and testam^t Revoking all oth^r wills and testam^t
 in writing whoso^r I have heretofore put my hand and seal this 6th of y^e first
 moth in y^e year 1692
