 me I give and bequeath as followeth (viz^t)

It I give & Bequeath to my Nece Judith y^e wife of Robert Lancaster Jun^r two peaceter
 Dishes now in their possession and twenty Shillings in money—

It I Give to Charles Pitt twenty Shillings in money—

It I Give & bequeath to Charles Williams five hundred & thirty pounds of Tobacco &
 what ever y^e A Williams is Indebted to me an Iron pott now in his possession—

It I Give and bequeath all the rest and Remainder of my Estate of what nature or Quality
 Power to be Equally divided between my Brother William Clary, my Sister Ann Pitt,
 and my Nephew Edward Brown.

Hereby Revoking and making void all wills & Testament by me heretofore made & do
 appoint my Nephew Edward Brown to be whole & Sole Ex^r of this my last will &
 Testament In Witness whereof I have here unto Set my hand & Seal this 25th day of
 September 1707
