loving friends Tho: Soferast & Tho: Gray, whom I appoynt to  
be my Exors after my due debts are paid, to be Equally divided

It I give to Joan Gray the Daughter of Francis Gray two  
hundred pounds of 100<sup>l</sup> in the hands of the said Francis to be layd  
out for a boy for, & all above written I have sett my hand  
this first of March 1675
