Testament to be as follows

And for my worldly goods I dispose of as followeth
I give unto Joan Nelson whom she is for a Wastcoat
Cloath that is now in the house

And to W^m Browne the son of Maj^r Browne my Semitor
And unto the Coll Geo: Jordan m^r Ben: Hargison m^r Arthur
Jordan, m^r Nath: Knight, Maj^r W^m Browne m^r Tho:
Jordan, m^r Walter Fildes, Thos Hogwood m^r Ni: Ollernwellthor, m^r
Jas: Jordan m^r Edw: Baly m^r Rob: Keepe m^r Jⁿ: Moring to
Each of those one ff of gloves of red & purple at each

Lastly I ordaine m^r Christopher Foster my sole Ex^r: who
I appointe to pay all my Just due debts to Every person to
whom my Will is directed, & to see my body buried & decently
Interred, praying to God to send us a happy meeting in his
Kingdome, And I desire that it may be remembered that
my Ex^r: do receive of Ann Lowndes my bolster belonging
to this bed under me, & give her a Notcher in the Rime of it
And I do declare Seale & Signe this to be my last Will & Testam^t
this 25th of September 1676

 cloaths both Linnen & Wollen, which I am now possessor of
 Unto Edward Arny the Son of Thomas Arny (deceased) I give
 and bequeath a feather bed, & the share of my land I am now
 possessor of,
 And to my wife Elizabeth Bish I give & bequeath all by right of
 my Estate both within doors & without, both moveable
 & immoveable, likewise all lands, leasehold or whatsoever
 appertaining unto me in any kind I give unto her my
 whole being paid, And in testimony hereof I have here set my
 hand this 4th day of June A.D. 1676
