 of one pott & pott hooks one bed & bedding, one cow & one bull
 All the rest & residue of my estate in good all that shall be found mine
 or any way appertaining to me, I give unto my Loving Wife
 Elmor Rawling & to my two Children Mary & John Rawling
 as it shall stand with best discretion to dispose of & them it to
 be in her possession till they come to age, Myself do make &
 constitute my Loving Wife Elmor Rawling to be my true &
 Lawfull executrix of this my last Will & Testament, in witness
