I Give bequeath to my Loving Wife Elizabeth my two old Negroes Jack and Mary her Chamber handsonely furnished and one third part of all & singular the remanining pt of my personal Estate

I Give bequeath unto my Loving Daughter Catherine the wife of Ar: Allen & to her heirs forever all my Lands Tenements & hereditaments to me belonging or in any wise appertaining with all & Every the Rights members & appurtenances thereon or thereunto belonging & the other two third pt of my personal Estate

I do hereby constitute appoynt & ordaine my Dear & well beloved Wife Elizabeth & my Loving Son Arthur Allen to be my Exors of this my last Will & Testament hereby revoking making void & null all former Wills by me made & signed declaring this to be my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 18th of March 1687
