In the Name of God Amen I the Clarke of upper  
Chippendale Crooke in Southwarke parish in the County of Surrey  
being sick & weak of body but in perfect sound memory  
do make this my last Will & Testament whosoever  
it shall please the Almighty God to take me out of this  
mortal life I Bequeath my soule to him my Brethren  
Trusting in the almighty merits of Jesus Christe my bles-  
sed Saviour & Redemer resting in sure & certain  
hope of resurrection & my body to the Earth from  
whence it came to be decently Interred for what  
worldly Estate it hath pleased God to bestow upon me  
It is my will and desire that it be disposed as followeth  
First I do give unto my Daughter Hannah one pair  
of bed & bolster & a red rug & a pair of blankets & a  
pair of sheets & a bedstead & three pewter dishes & an iron  
pot of four gallons & three cows & two two years  
old heifers & a yearling calf & whosoever comes of  
this & a yearling filly & secondly I do give unto  
my daughter Mary one bed of feathers & flock  
together & bolster & a smooth red rug & a pair  
of blankets & a trunk bedstead & three cows & two  
two years old heifers & a yearling calf & a bag of  
fourteen gallons and two large pewter dishes & two large  
pewter plates Thirdly I do give unto my son Thomas  
all my Land in generall after the decease of my  
Wife & a flock bed & bolster & a good rug &  
a pair of good canvas sheets & three cows & a young  
heifer & two steers of two years old & a piece of large  
old gun & two leather chairs after his coming of  
Age & further it is my will and desire that after my  
son comes of age if my wife be not willing  
to leave the plantation whereto I now live that
