In the Name of God Amen I Christopher Fofter being sick and Weak in Body but in perfect Sense and Memory thank God to God for it do make and Appoint this my Last Will and Testament, as followeth

First I Bequeath my Soul to God that gave it me, and my Body to be buried at y<sup>e</sup> discretion of my Loving Wife in hope and full Assurance that through y<sup>e</sup> Merits of Jesus Christ my Saviour I shall be raised to Life Eternal and as for my worldly goods I dispose of them as followeth

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Eldest Son John Fofter my Man lat. which I now live upon with all my Land thereto belonging to him y<sup>e</sup> said John Fofter and his Heires for ever.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Youngest Son Christopher Fofter my Man lat. which I bought of Abraham Evans near the Blackwater Swamp with all my Land thereto belonging to him y<sup>e</sup> said Christopher Fofter and his Heires for ever.

Further It is my Will that all y<sup>e</sup> rest of my Estate In general be equally divided betwixen and among my Loving Wife and my four Children In: Fofter Christopher Fofter Faith Fofter and Peter Fofter.

and I do also Nominate and Appoint my Loving Wife Elizabeth Fofter and her Father Mr<sup>r</sup> Th<sup>r</sup> Bagher Execut<sup>r</sup> and Execut<sup>r</sup> Jointly of this my Last Will and Testament. Whom I desire to see paid all my Last Debts and to see this my Will performed Caving this to be my Last Will and Testament Whoseunto I have Sett my hand and Seal unto this.

Whereas the upper part of this Will hath been Long made and it hath pleased God to Call me with three full year more since to say Peace Robert and Fortune Fofter It is my Will that they come In and have Equal parts with my Wife and four Children above named of my personall Estate and forther I Give unto my Son Robert Fofter all that part of the land above given unto my Son Christopher which lyeth on the East Side of the Branch Called the Cottal Branch to him y<sup>e</sup> said Robert Fofter and his Heires for ever it being above all Given unto my Son Christopher notwithstanding

Further I Give and Bequeath unto my Loving Wife Elizabeth Fofter the God Know lie upon with the ring Bankett Sheth Badstead Matt and Cord now thereto belonging overland above her part. In the Division and that the rest of my Will above Written stands as there written Acknowledging this to be my Last Will and Testament Whoseunto I have Sett my hand and Seal unto this 27<sup>th</sup> day of March 17<sup>th</sup> 55.

My Will is that my Son Th<sup>r</sup> Fofter have all my rest of the Land at Nottaway and that he pay all the Charges out of his own part.
