I bequeath my Soul to almighty God who gave it me & hope through the meritts of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ our Lord, to find a happy resurrection at the Last Day. & as for earthly body, I bequeath to the Earth from whence it was taken to be buried Decently as my Dear & Loving Wife shall see most fitt.

Item: My Land I now live on I leave to my Dear & Loving wife During her Natural Life & after her Decease I give it to Faith Maggott, for Ever to sell or Dispose of it which she sees most fitt.

Lastly: I give my Dear & Loving wife all my Personall Estate, wholly & Solely all her own Disposal & Ordain my whole and sole Executor & Do revoke all former wills, Gifts Grants & Ordain this my Last Will & Testament. As Witness my hand and Seal this ninth Day of October 1712

Item: I give and bequeath my Soul into the hands of God that gave it me in hope of Eternal Joy and Happiness and my Body to the Ground to be Decently buried according to the Discretion of my Executor hereafter nominated.

Item: I give and bequeath to my Loving Wife Elizabeth one silver bed and furniture and half a Dutch prover Dishew and a third part of what Linnen and Woollens that belongs to the Estate and four cows and a half part of the sheep and a Stear a year all this During her Life & then to return to my Executor.

Item: I give and bequeath to my Son Henry Jones two Cows.

Item: I give and bequeath to my Son William Jones one Shilling

Item: I give and bequeath to my Son John Jones one Shilling.

Item: I give and bequeath to my Loving Son Robert Jones all my Land, and all the rest of my Estate of what Nature or Quality so ever making him my whole and sole Executor of this my Last Will and Testament. In Witness my hand and Seal this third Day of February 1712.

This Indenture made the 21st Day of March in the twelfth year of the Reigne of our Sovereign Lady Ann by the grace of God of Great Brittain France and Ireland Queen Defender of the faith &c. and in the year of our said one thousand seven hundred and twelve between John Diford of the County of Lunny Planter of the One part & Robert Crasford of the same County Planter of the Other parts Witnesseth that said John Diford for & in Consideration of y^e sum of two shillings to him in hand paid by y^e said Robert Crasford at and before y^e Enrolling & Signing of these presents, the Receipt whereof and himself therewith fully satisfied contented and paid he doth hereby acknowledge & for some other good causes him therunto Movinge He hath granted bargained sold Dimittes Leased & to firm Letten & by these presents doth grant & bargain sell Dimittes & to firm Lett unto the said Robert Crasford his Executors Administrators and Assignes a Certain tract or parcel of open Cultivate in the parish of Lawne Creek in the County aforesaid Containing three hundred Acres of Land be the same more or less which said Tract or parcel of Land was granted to Robert Dace by Patent Dated y^e twentieth Day of April 1682 & by the said
