As for earthly body I bequeath to the Earth from whence it was taken to be buried decently as my Dear & Loving Wife shall see most fit.

Item: And I now leave all my Dear & Loving wife During her Natural Life & after her Decease I give it to Faith Magott for her to sell or dispose of it which she sees most fit.

Lawfully I give my Dear & Loving wife all my Personall Estate wholly & Solely all her own Disposall & Ordain my whole Estate & to revoke all former wills & gifts grants & ordains this my Last Will & Testament. As witness my hand and Seal this ninth Day of October 1752

Item: I give and bequeath to my Loving Wife Elizabeth one fitter bed and furniture and half a Drapster Dishes and a third part of what Lining and Walking that belongs to the Estate and four Cows and a half a cart of the sheep and a Sheep a year all this During her Life then to return to my lastutor.

Item: I give and bequeath to my Son Henry Jones two Cows.

Item: I give and bequeath to my Son William Jones one Shilling

Item: I give and bequeath to my Son John Jones one Shilling.

Item: I give and bequeath to my Loving Son Robert Jones all my Land and all the rest of my Estates of what Nature or Quality so ever making him my whole and sole Executrix of this my Last Will and Testament In Witness my hand and Seal this third Day of February 1752

This Indenture made g^t 26th Day of March in the twelfth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign lady Anne by grace of God of Great Britain France and Ireland Queen Defender of the faith etc and in the Year of our Lord one thousand Seven hundred and twelve Robert Gafford of the County of Surry Planter of the One party & Robert Gafford of the same County Planter of the Other party Witnesseth that the said John Diford for & in Consideration of sume of five shillings to him in hand paid by the said Robert Gafford at and before g^t Entering of this Indenture presents the Receipt whereof and himself therewith fully satisfied Contented and paid let deth hereby acknowledge & for diverse other good Causes him therunto Movings & hath granted bargained sold Dimised Liened & to have Liened & by these presents Both grantor & grantee set Demise & to have Liened unto the said Robert Gafford his Executrix Administress and Assign a certain tract or parcel of Land situated in the parish of Lanes Creek in the County of Surry containing three hundred acres of Land be the same more or less which said Tract or parcel of Land was granted to Robert Hare by Patent dated yesteryear the Day of April 1662 & by the said
