 and Thomas Billberis Bill of eleven hundred pounds tobacco. I Give to my Daughter Jane Harris One
 Cow and Calf three pewter Dishes and One pewter Basin my small feather bed with a rug and Blankett an
 Belonging to it One Iron pott and One Chest three hundred pounds tobacco att St. Nicolson.

I Give three Pounds Equally divided betwixt those three aforementioned Legtees
 Lastly I Give to my Daughter Elizabeth Harris all the remaining part of my Estate and do Appoint Captaine
 and Ordain her my whole and Sole Executrix of this my Last Will and Testament.
