Item I give and bequeath unto William Read one feather bed and all the furniture thereto belonging and four pewter Dishes and three pewter plates and one pewter pot and one pewter saltceller and I give unto William Read my great brass Kettle and two Cows and Calves and one of the largest Heifers and two of the largest of the rest of the cattle that is unbequeathed and two little hogs and five of the best of the young hogs that remains and my old great Gun.

Item I give to Samuel Read the son of William Read one young heifer and to Mary the Daughter of William Read one young heifer.

Item I give to William the Son and Mary the Daughter of William Rowland to each of them a young heifer.

Item I give to Mary Hill my new Chest and I give to William Read one of my Chests and I give to William Rowland my other Chest.

Item I give all the rest of my household goods and hogs that is unbequeathed and the Wheat to be Equally Divided between John Hill, William Rowland and William Read, all to be Divided & Delivered at the Discretion of my Executor.

In my will and I write is John Hill have all the pigs now growing on the plantation he paying the Rent and Taxes.

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving friend Samuel Thompson my young bay horse and I do nominate Constitute and appoint him my whole and sole Executor as witness my hand and Seal this 26th Day of June 1754.

and estate it hath been pleased god to bestow and give me to dispose of in manner & forme following.

I give and bequeath my Negro Woman Mary and all her increase to my Daughter Jane
Russin and the lawful heirs of her body for ever and for want of such heirs to my Son
William Russin and his heirs for ever.

I further give and bequeath to my said Daughter Jane one New feather bed and furniture
there with curtains and valances etc: which my son Robert promised me to send her by
our Agreement when made over the house and other goods to him and one small table
that stands over the hall with one small Draper cloth and one Chest one Iron yott
of about two Gallons one pair of Iron yotts rechte that hangs in the kitchen one box
mothing Iron and one brass spise storke and peppell and one Looking glass that hangs
in the chamber and seven pewter Dishes six pewter plates six pewter spoons and
two silver spoons.

I do make Ordaine Constitute and Appoint my said Daughter Jane my whole and sole
Executrix making void all former Wills by me made and make this my last will
