

adjoining to the Plantation as above given to my son John, but it is my Will that if the said Abraham Matchamore dye without Issue that then that parcel of Land is to be my son John Evans and the heirs lawfully begotten of his body for ever: as also I give & bequeath unto my son William Evans one Cow Cattle with a heifer of two years old as also to my said son William Evans two sows: Item: I also give unto Elizabeth Evans my wife my plantation with all houses and pieces thereunto belonging with privilege also of one hundred acres of Land thereunto belonging as above given to my son John Evans for her the said Elizabeth to make use of & to live upon During her Natural life: I also give & bequeath unto Elizabeth Evans my wife all my goods & Chattels whatsoever after all my Just Debts & Legacies are paid, to a my request unto my said wife Elizabeth that if y^e stock of sheep which I give her proffer that she shall each each of my sons John & William. wth y^e Increase thereof: And I do by these presents nominate John Evans my son to be whole & sole Executor of this my Last Will & Testament & revoking & renouncing all former wills I have herunto set my hand Seal this fourth day of August. 1702.

In the name of God Amen: I Francis Maybury of y^e County of Surry & y^e upper parishes being weak in body but of sound & perfect memory (praised be God) do make & ordain this my Last Will and Testament hereby making void & revoking all other Wills heretofore made in manner & form following. (Or)

Item: I bequeath my soul into the hands of God that gave it me in hopes of Eternal happiness through the merits of my Blessed Saviour Jesus Christ & my body to the ground to be decently buried according to the Direction of my Executor hereafter Nominated;

Item: I give & bequeath unto my son Francis Maybury a parcel of Land which I bought of John Freeman as it is Recorded in Charles City County: I also give my said son Francis a parcel of Land which I bought of Thomas Busby as it is recorded in y^e said County.

Item: I give & bequeath unto my son George Maybury a piece of Land Quantity one hundred & twenty five acres which lies on the horn branch at the three forks.

Item: I give & bequeath unto my two sons Charles Maybury & my son Phineas Maybury a piece of Land which I intended for upon Quantins Creek & y^e Entry Islands good to be equally divided between them and it be not good to have as much out of y^e estate at once take up four hundred acres of Land between the two said Sons.

Item: I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Ann Dixons one live and Lamb.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Fox one live and Lamb.

Item: I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Judith Maybury one live & Lamb.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my Loving wife Elizabeth one Indian man Named Robin and one Indian boy Jack and a mulatto Girl shall the rest of my personal Estate of what nature or quality whatsoever hereby making and Nominating her the whole & sole Executrix of this my Last Will & Testament in Witness whereof I have herunto set my hand and seal this two & twentieth day of March Anno Dom. 1702
