

adjoining to the Plantation as above given to my son John, but it is my Will that of the said Abraham Mactlemore Dye without Issue that then that parcel of Land is to be by my son John Evans and the same lawfully Begotten of his body for ever: as also I give & Bequeath unto my son William Evans one hundred acres of Land & one half of two years old as also to my said son William Evans two wives: Item: I also give unto Elizabeth Evans my wife my plantation with all houses and pines therunto belonging with privilege also of Elizabeth to make use of & to live upon During her Natural life & also give & Bequeath unto Elizabeth Evans my wife all my goods & Chattels whatsoever after all my just Debts & Legacys are paid, this being my request unto my said wife Elizabeth that if y<sup>e</sup> stock or Sheep which I give her proffer that she shall stock each of my sons John & William w<sup>t</sup> of Increase thereto. And I do by these presents nominate John Evans my son to be whole sole Executor of this my Last will & Testament & revoking & renouncing all former wills I have heretofore set my hand & seal this fourth day of August 1703.

In the name of God Amen: I Francis Maybury of the County of Surry & y<sup>e</sup> upper parish being weak in body but of sound & perfect memory (praised be god) do make & ordain this my Last will and Testament hereby making void & revoking all other Wills heretofore made in manner & form following. QD  
I bequeath my soul into the hands of god that gave it me in hope of Eternall happiness through the merits of my Beloved Saviour Jesus Christ & my body to the ground to be decently buried according to the Direction of my Executor hereafter Nominated;

I give & Bequeath unto my son Francis Maybury a parcel of Land which I bought of John Freeman and is Recorded in Charles City County I also give my said son Francis a parcel of Land which I bought of Thomas Husby as it is recorded in y<sup>e</sup> said County.

I give & Bequeath unto my son George Maybury a piece of Land Quantily one hundred & twenty five acres wher

Lies on the river Branch at the three flocks.  
I give & Bequeath unto my two Sons Charles Maybury & my son Stephen Maybury a piece of Land which I intended for upon mountain Creek & y<sup>e</sup> entry lands good to be equally Divided betwix them and if it be not good to have so much out of y<sup>e</sup> estate alreadie take up our hundred acres of Land between the two said Sons.

I give & Bequeath unto my Daughter Ann Dixie one hundred and Land.

I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Fox one hundred and Land.

I give & Bequeath unto my Daughter Judith Maybury one hundred and Land:

I give and Bequeath unto my loving wife Elizabeth one Indian man Named Robin and one Indian boy Jack and a mulatto girl & all the rest of my personal Estate of what nature or quality whatsoever hereby making and Nominating her the whole sole Executrix of this my Last will & Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this two & twenty fifth day of March Anno Domini 1703.
