In the Name of God Amen I George Randall of the County of Surry & the upper Parish being weak in body but of sound & perfect memory praised be God do make & ordain this my Last Will & Testam^t hereby making void & revoking all other Wills heretofore made in manner & forme following - Vis -

1st I bequeath my Soul into the hands of God that gave it me in hopes of Evernall happyness through the merit of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ & my body to the Ground to be decently buried according to the discretion of my Executors hereafter nominated. -

2^d I give & bequeath unto my Son Peter two Cows & two young Steers & one young heifer of about two years old & two five & twenty head of hogs over the River there being five Sows & the rest barrens & a small gun & sword & a young horse of about two years old & a feather bed from his mother - when he comes to the age of twenty & one years & one year with two lambs; I give & bequeath unto my Son Peter & his Estate to keep till the said Peter comes to the age of twenty one years, but to have part of his time from eighteen years old. -

3^d I give & bequeath unto my youngest Son two Cows & a two year old heifer & a two year old Steer & five & twenty head of hogs of about two years old one with another & one young horse of three years old & one year & lamb & a flock bed with rug & blankets -

It: I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Mary two Cows & one heifer of two years old & a two years old Bear & one yearling heifer & five & twenty head of Hops of about two years old and with another & a year & lamb & a pott & a panes.

It: I give & bequeath unto my Loving wife Elisabeth all the rest of my personal Estate of what nature or quality whatsoever hereby making nominating her the whole & Sole Executrix of this my last Will & Testament In witness my hand & Seal this tenth day of February A: 1750.

Impi: My Will is that my Son Robert shall have the Plantatⁿ wherein David died lately lived & the division between the two said Plantats to be as it was in the said David's time & if my Daughter Elisabeth pleaseth as long as she remains unmarried she shall have tolleration & priviledge on the said Plantat with Robert.

It: My Will is that all the rest of my Goods & Chattells in whatsoever kind that I have my just debts being first paid may be equally divided between my six Children & my Loving wife before mentioned whom I make my Sole Executrix of this my Last Will & Testament In Testimony of which I have hereunto put my hand & Seal this day & year above written.
