weak in body but of sound & perfect memory praised be God do make & ordain this my Last Will
& Testament hereby making void & revoking all other Wills heretofore made in manner & forme
following — And —

I bequeath my Soul into the hands of God that gave it me in hopes of eternall happiness through the
merit of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ & my body to the Ground to be decently buried according
to the discretion of my Executors hereafter nominated. —

I give & bequeath unto my Son Peter two Cows & two young Steers & one young heifer of about two
years old & two fowls & twenty head of hogs over the River there being five Sons & the rest Cattle
& a Small gun & sword & a young horse of about two years old & a feather bed from his mother —
when he comes to the age of Twenty & one years & one year with two lambs; I give & bequeath
unto Willm Nancy my Son Peter & his Estate to keep till the said Peter comes to the age of twenty
one years, but to have part of his time from eighteen years old. —

I give & bequeath unto my youngest Son two Cows & a two year old heifer & a two year old Steer & five &
twenty head of hogs of about two years old one with another & one young horse of three years old & one
year & lamb & a flock bed with rug & blankets —

It is given & bequeath unto my Daughter Mary two Cows & one heifer of two years old & a two years old Stare & one yearling heifer & five & twenty head of hogs of about two years old and with another & a yearling lamb & a pott & a parson.

It is given & bequeath unto my Loving wife Elizabeth all the rest of my personall Estate of what nature or quality whatsoever heretofore making nominating her the whole & sole Executrix of this my last Will & Testamēt In witness my hand & Seal this tenth day of February A.D. 1750.

I John Derryman of Laines Creek Parish in the County of Surry being Rich & weak in body yet appraised by God of reasonable sense & memory do make ordain & constituted this my last Will & Testamēt as for the disposing of what worldly Estate it hath pleased God to bestow upon me this 23 day of August 1755. My Will & desir'd is that my Loving wife shall have the Plantation wheron we now live during her naturall life & after her death to my Son John & his heirs.

Imp: My Will is that my Son Robert shall have the Plantation wheron David Dines lately lived & the division between the two said Plantations to be as it was in the Said Dines time & if my Daughter Elizabeth pleafeth as long as she remains unmarried she shall have tolleration & prouidencie on the said Plantation with Robert.

It is given & bequeath unto my Daughter Mary all the rest of my Goods & Chattells in whatsoeuer kind that I have my just debts being first paid may be equally divided between my Six Children & my Loving wife before mention'd whom I make my sole Executrix of this my Last Will & Testamēt In Testimony of which I have hereunto put my hand & Seal this day & year above written.
