In the Name of God Amen I James Ellis of Southwark parish in Surrey County being sick and weak of body but of disposing mind and memory thanks be to God for it being incalable it is appointed for all flesh once to dye do therefore make this my Last Will & Testament in manner and form as followeth.

First I give and bequeath my soule to God that gave it me and my body to the ground to be decently buried at the Discretion of my Executor hereafter named and as for what worldly goods it hath pleased God to bestow upon me I give and bequeath as followeth.

Item

It is my Will and Desire that all my Just Debts and funerall Charges be first paid. I give and bequeath unto John Hill my two Negroes Tom and Belly and my old horse called Thaver & my Cart and wheels and the bed and furniture that belongs to it whereon he usually lyes and the Negroes bedding and one Iron pot the midlin pot and one brass Skillett and four silver Dishes and the old Fanstard and two Cows one Calves and one barren Cow and two of the largest Hears and four of the Young Hears and all the new waives that is in the house and all the money that is due to me In England in the hands of Jonathan earth and also three of my Killable hogs and the Carpenters Tools.

Item

I give and bequeath unto Sarah Hill daughter of John Hill my Correll mare called honey

and her filly and one young heifer of three year old and my two little brass Kettle.
Item: I give and bequeath to William Rowland my great feather bed and all the furniture belonging to it and four pewter Dishes and one pewter handstand and three plates and one saltceller Bone trap Kettle and the Iron pot that is in his possession and I give him two Cows and Calves and one barron Cow and two of the largest Bears and two young heifers and two of my killable hogs and five young hogs more.

Item: I give and bequeath unto William Reade one feather bed and all the furniture thereto belonging and four pewter Dishes and three pewter plates and one pewter pot and one pewter saltceller and I give unto William Reade my great brass Kettle and two Cows and Calves and one of the largest Bears and seven of the largest of the rest of the Cattle that is unbequeathed and two killable hogs and five of the best of the young hogs that remains and my old great Gun.

Item: I give to Samuell Read the son of William Reade one young heifer and to Mary the Daughter of William Reade one young heifer.

Item: I give to William the Son and Mary the Daughter of William Rowland to each of them a young heifer.

Item: I give to Mary Hill my new Trunk and I give to William Read one of my Chests and I give to William Rowland my other Chest.

Item: I give all the rest of my household goods and hogs that is unbequeathed and the wheat to be Equally Divided between John Hill William Rowland and William Reade all to be Divided & Delivered at the Discretion of my Executor.

In my Will and Teste is John Hill haire all the Crops now growing on the plantation he paying the Rent and Taxes.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my Loving friend Samuell Thompson my young bay horse and I do nominate constitute and appoint him my whole and sole Executor as witness my hand and Seal this 26th Day of June 1711.

First and principally above all worldly things do commend my soule to Almighty God trusting and firmly believing through the merits and bitter passion of my alone Saviour Jesus Christ to receive full pardon and Remission for all my sins here committed when ever this mortal life shall cease and my body to be decently interred from whence it was taken after the manner of Christian buriall at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter named and for what worldly goods and estate it hath been pleased God to bestow and give me do dispose of in manner & forme following.

Item: I give and bequeath my Negro Woman Chary and all her Increase to my Daughter Jane Ruffin and the Lawfull heirs of her body for ever and for want of such heirs to my Son William Ruffin and his heirs for ever.

Item: I farther give and bequeath to my said Daughter Jane one New feather bed and furniture with Curtains and Valiances &c: which my son Robert promised me to find her by our Agreement when made over the house and other goods to him and one small table that stands over the hall with one small Draper cloth and one Chest one Iron yott of aboute five Gallons one pair of Iron yott racks that hangs in the Kitchin one box moothering Iron and one brass pipe mortar and pestle and one Looking Glass that hangs in the Chamber and seven pewter Dishes six pewter plates six pewter spoons and two silver spoons.

Item: I do make Ordain constitute and Appoint my said Daughter Jane my whole and sole Executrix making void all former Wills by me made and make this my last Will
