- 3: And as for the worldly good the Lord hath been pleased to bestow upon me I give & bequeath as followeth after my Just Debts are well & Truly paid.
- Item: I give & bequeath unto my Grandson William Foster one white Keffor of three years old and the gun he uses to shoot in.
- Item: I do nominate & appoint & constitute my Loving wife Catherine my wife & sole Executrix of this my last Will & Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 18th Day of February 1722
