Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter William Six cows or four fillows One clew four sheep four Sows the Cud and all the furniture belongin to it, that is to say my best bed One Iron pott one brass Kettle four pewter Dishes, the plantations with all the Land I now live upon to her & her Heirs for ever my pearing mays & her two Culls & all that her Heirs shall bring.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son William all my Cocks my Trooper Armes two Cows, and to his Daughter Sarah a Cow & Calf her father to have the male & she the female for his Trouble in Looking after it.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son George two Cows & to his Son Peter a Cow & Calf his father to have the male & she the female for his Trouble in Looking after it.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah a Cow and Calf & to her son Henry a Cow & Calf the male to his father and the female to him, the male for the Trouble in Looking after it.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Henry my small Horse the old Cud that is at his House One Iron pott two pewter Dishes & the old Mare and the filly she hath with her now with all she shall bring hereafter.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son James all the rest of my horses Mares Cattle Hogs sheep Houfairs Luff money Debts Including all the rest of my Estate both Dead and personall that shall be Left after my Legacies and Debts are all paid. And I do make my son James whole Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have with my hand & scale this first Day of August In the year of our Lord God 1722.

I desire that my mother Elizabeth Forver may have the Use and service of my black horse called puppy During her Natural life & if alive after her Death I give the said Horse to my Sister Sarah Boyer & to her Heirs I give my best Chest & two pewter Dishes & three plates & one Iron pott to my Sister Mary Forver I give one pewter Dish & three plates to Samuel Forver I give a gun that is now in his house one gun I give to Benjamin Bailey my brother Anselms Son to my brother Anselm Bailey I give my best Coat and Jackett and my best hat & all my Looms & fowls to my brother Walter Bailey I give my Gray horse the pare of White & holsters & three Yards of Virginia Coats & 1/2 yds of Orenbings & a fying pan to my Sister Sarah I give two Camlets Indian Corn & one pewter Dish & a bed I give Int^r Duman my second best Chest & a pair of Black Shoes and Larn Lockins & my second best hat & a Virginia Coats waistcoat & a pair of Shoes & breeches to my Cousin William Warren I give two Jacketts to Capt Holt's son Thomas I give & that Capt Holt owe me my part of Corn & a parcel of Told in Mr Chambers hands & all and a parcel in Mrs Priors hands and all other Debts due to me I give to my two brothers Anselm & Walter Bailey I appoint them my Executors of this my last Will and Testament. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Wright one 00 negro Man called Jeter during her life and after her Decease if please God she happen to Dye before the Negro that then for ever after the said Negro she shall be free and for all y^e rest of my Estate I make my beloved Wife Mary Wright My Executor wholly and solely after my Death to pay & the above mentioned Legacies given all the rest to belong to her in particular.
