praised to the Almighty but knowing there is a time appointed for all men once to dye To make  
this my Last Will and Testament as followeth:

I give and Bequeath my Soul to God that gavet me relying on f: Merritt of my Blessed Saviour  
John Christ to receive full remission of all my Sin and my Body to f: Earth to be decently buried at  
Discretion of my Executor hereafter named.

I give and Bequeath unto my Son William Hunt two hundred Acres of Land lying and Adjoyning  
upon the Plantation where I now live to him and his Heires forever and One Negro Woman with  
all her future increase the said Negro Woman Named Kate but my Will and desire is f: my Wife shall  
have f: said Negro Woman during her Natural Life.

I give and Bequeath unto my Son Thos: Hunt four hundred Acres of Land Adjoyning to my now dwelling  
Plantation and One Negro boy named Sam to him and his Heire forever and my Horse Dericke with one  
Trooping Saddle and Bridle and all my Trooping Arms.

I give and Bequeath unto my Son John Hunt my Now dwelling plantation with all f: Land between the  
Tay and Branch and Other Branch and One Negro boy called Peter to him and his Heire forever.

I give and Bequeath unto my Son George Hunt the Plantation where f: Wapple formerly lived with three  
hundred acres of Land Adjoyning thereto to him and his Heires forever.

I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Hunt the Plantation where Katherine Middleton  
formerly dwelt with One hundred Acres of Land Adjoining thereto her and her Heires for ever.  
I Give and Bequeath unto my two Daughters Elizabeth and Mary Hunt to Each One hundred  
Acres of Land upon my head Line on y<sup>e</sup> Hunting Quarter Dwamps.  
And after all my Just Debts are Fully paid my Will is for the remainder part of my Estate to be  
Equally divided Between my Wife and all my Children and I do Ordaine my Deare wife to be Whole  
Executor of this my Last Will and Testament and my Will and Desire is that Mrs. Nathaniel Hanger  
Capt Henry Hanger and Mr. J. Timmons have y<sup>e</sup> oversight of this my Last Will and Testament
