In the Name of God Amen I William Roobings of the County of Surrey being weak of body but of perfect mind and
memory thanks be to Almighty God for the same Do make constitute and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament
hereby revoking all former Wills by me made any thing therein mentioned to the contrary notwithstanding.

I bequeath my Soul to Almighty God who gave it and fully trusting in the merits and mediation of my ever blessed
Saviour Christ Jesus for the pardon of all my sins, and my body to the Earth from whence it came to be buried in such
Christian manner as my Executors shall think fit in hope of a Joyfull Resurrection in the last day to dwell with
him for what worldly Estate it hath please my gracious God to bless me with all his grace and bequeath in manner and formes following.

I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Roobings for life and if she marrys within three years after the Date of these presents
then to her said Husband for his life a part of that Parcel of Land which Mr Bartholomew Clements gave known by
name of Rings and after their Decease to return to my son William Roobings and his heirs for ever.

I give to my Daughter Susanah and her husband Charles Hamlin for their lives the Remainder part of the above said
parcel known by the Name of Greens and after their Decease to return to my son William Roobings and his heirs for ever.

I give to my Daughter Mary Roobings for life and if she ever marrys for her husband's life a meadow of Land called the
broad reach lying on the East Side of the head of William Crofts Swamps and after their Decease to return to my son
James Roobings and his heirs for ever.

I give to my son James Roobings and his heirs for ever all the Remainder part of my outward Decent of Land containing
four hundred and Eighteen Acres and my Negro boy Will.

I give to my Daughter Ann Roobings one good feather bed and one bolster one Rugg and pair of Blanketts and one kilt
and one Iron pot and one young Cow and calf.

I give to my Daughter Sarah Roobings my Negro boy Jack.

I give to my son William Roobings and his heirs for ever all the rest of my Land in general and all my trougers Armes

I give to my Loving Wife her Choice of any one of my feather beds and furniture and one good Ring and my little horse with
her saddle and bridle and my boots and harness and all my fowls and her hound and my Negro man till my son William arrive
to the age of twenty one years and then my Negro I give to my son.

And for the rest and Residue of my personal Estate after my just Debts and Legacies paid I give to be Equally Divided
amongst my Affectionate Wife and children here and here aboves.

And I do appoint my Loving Wife Ann Roobings Sole Executrix of this my Last and Testament.

And I do Desire that my good friends Mr Nathaniel Harrison, Cap^t Henry Harrison, Mr William Fisher
and Mr John Simmons will do for trouble themselves in favour to me as to whether my last Will performed.

I give my Loving Wife Ann Roobings my Negro Wench Ann provided she pay Mr Harris and Mr Allen
what I justly owe them and I Desire that all my Debts both here and in England should be Disposed of to pay
my other just Debts I do Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seale this first of February 1714
