In the name of god Amen I William Rockings of the County of Surrey being weak of body but of perfect memory thanks be to Almighty God for the same do make constitute and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills by me made any thing therein mentioned to the contrary notwithstanding I bequeath my soul to Almighty God who gave it steadfastly trusting in the merits and mediation of my well blessed saviour Christ Jesus for the pardon of all my sins. Ode my body to the Earth from whence it came to be buried in such Christian manner as my executors shall think fit in hope of a Joyfull Resurrection in the last day to eternal life & for what worldly Estate it hath pleased my gracious God to bestow me with all do give and bequeath in manner and forme following I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Rockings for life and if she marries within three years after the Date of these presents then to her said Husband for his life a part of that Parcement of Land which Mr Bartholomew Clements goes known by name of Rings and after their Decease to return to my son William Rockings and his heirs for ever. — I give to my Daughter Susannah and her husband Charles Hamlin for their lives the Remainder part of the aforesaid — old land, known by the name of Greens and after their Decease to return to my son William Rockings and his heirs for ever. — I give to my Daughter Mary Rockings for life and if she ever marries fit her husband life a meadow of Land called the broad meadow lying on the East Side of the head of William Snotts Swamp and after their Decease to return to my son James Rockings and his heirs for ever. —

I give to my son James Rockings and his heirs for ever all the Remainder part of my outward Devide of Land containing four hundred and eighteen Acres and my Negro boy Will —

I give to my Daughter Ann Rockings one good feather bed and a boulster over Pugg and pair of blankets and one quilt and one other polt and one young cow and calf —

I give to my Daughter Jane Rockings my Negre boy Jack —

I give to my Son William Rockings one his heirs for ever all the rest of my Land in generall and all my trauers Arms —

I give to my loving Wife her choice of any one of my feather beds and furniture and one yoddling and my cornish horse both —

her saddle and bridle and my books and connoc and all my fowls and her bruch, and my Negre man till my son William arrive —

to the age of twenty one years and then my Negro I give to my son —

And for the rest and Residue of my personal Estate after my just Debts and Legacies paid I give to be Equally Divided amongst my affectionate Wife and Children. Hear and bear witness —

And I do appoint my loving Wife Ann Rockings sole Executrix of this my last and Testament —

And I do direct that my god friends Col: Nathaniel Harrison, Cap: Henry Harrison, Col: William Cooke —

and Mr: John Simmons will be for trouble themselves in favour to me as to see this my last Will performed —

I give my loving Wife Ann Rockings my Negre Wench Nan provided she pay Col: Harris and Mr: Allen —

what I justly owe them and I desire that all my Servants both here and in England Should be Disposed off to pay —

my other just Debts. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this first of February 1754
