and publish this my last will and testament
in manner and form following (vizt)
I give unto my Son Thomas Taylor
one negro ~~woman~~ call'd Ned also one
negro Girl call'd Pott, one better Bed
bolster curtain and vallies one silk rug
and one blanket

It. I give unto my said son Thomas Taylor
the one moiety of all the neat cattle which
I have at the time of my Death -

2d. I give the other moiety of my said flock

of cattle to my son John Taylor -

It. I give unto my said ^{son} John Taylor
one negro boy call'd Roger - and one
negro boy call'd Kit. also one japane Table
and six ^{carp} chairs -

It. I give unto my daughter Elizabeth
Chambers, one Indian Woman call'd
Jenny, one boy call'd James and
one girl call'd Kate and one Bed Bolster
and Rugs and blanket -

It. I give unto my daughter Katherine Hobbs
one negro man call'd Sam one negro
Woman call'd Meneah, also one bed bolster
one Rugs and blanket.

It. I give unto Mary Tomlinson now wife of
John Tomlinson my negro woman call'd
Hannah

It all the rest and residue of my goods and

challenger I give to my said four children
(viz.) Thomas, John, Elizabeth & Katherine
to be Equally divided amongst them in
quantity and quality —
It - my Will is that my Estate shall not
be appraised, and I do hereby constitute
and appoint my sons Thomas & John
Taylor Executors of this my last will
and testament. I witness whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and
affixed my Seal this fourth Day
of February Annoque Domini one
Thousand seven hundred and forty
three

At a Court held for Surry County the 16th day of January 1744.
