 Life.

I Give and bequeath to my Son William Ellis the Plantation whereon I now live Containing five
 Hundred and twenty Acres of Land to him & his Heirs forever.

I Give and bequeath to my Son Jonathan Ellis one Tract of Land lying on the South side of Capstan
 Swamp Containing One Hundred and Ninety Acres of Land to him and his Heirs forever.

I Give and bequeath to my Son Benjamin Ellis my great Bible.

My Will is that my Dear and Loving Wife hold and enjoy all my Personal Estate after my Death
 Legacies are paid during her Natural life or Widowhood.

I Give to my dear Wife the Labour of my Negro Man Jack during her Natural life or Widowhood.
