In the name of Amen, I Edmund Jones of the Parish of Albemarle in the County of Sussex being sick and weak but of sound and disposing mind & memory do this first day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & sixty four make and Ordain this my last will and Testament in the manner and form following (that is to say) I Impower, I give to my Beloved Wife Rebecca the five following Negroes. Namely, Old Ned, Lucy, Nan, Lucy & Robin, During her natural life. Likewise I give my wife the use of my Plantation that she now live on until the Child she now goes with comes to the age of twenty one year. Item I give to my beloved Wife all my stock of horse, Hogg, Cattle & sheep & all my Household Furniture to her and her heirs for ever.

Item I give to the Child my wife now goes with all the Land I have in Sussex County if it live to marry or comes to the age of twenty one year, To him or her, his or her Heirs forever. I likewise give the same Child if it lives to marry or to the age of twenty one year the use following Negroes namely little Ned, with Judy, Beck, Tom & Sarah to him her his or her heirs for ever. But if the Child that my wife now goes with ^{with} should not live to marry or to the years of Twenty one then I give all the Land I have in Sussex County & the ^{Plantation} ~~Plantation~~ Negroes to my brother James Jones & my Cousin Sarah Elvinge to be sold & the

money arising from the sale of the Land of Negroes to be equally divided between my brother James Jones & Sarah Eldridge the Daughter of my sister Elizabeth with to them and their heirs.

Then I gave to the child that my wife now goes with if it should live to marry or to the age of Twenty one after the Decease of my wife the five negroes that I gave my wife but if the child should not live to marry or to the age of twenty one then I directed that the five negroes may be sold and the money raised by the sale may be equally divided between my brother James Jones & my Cousin David Eldridge the son of Thomas Eldridge.

Then I gave to my friend David Mason all my land in Brunswick and Lunenburg Counties to him and his heirs forever.

I moved that all my Debt Due on account of of gaming may be paid.
 I also I nominate constitute and appoint William Johnson & James Jones my Son & my wife my Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking and Disannulling all former wills by me made in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day and Year first within written
