of Virginia being vixen in Body but of perfect mind and Memory thankes be to Almighty God  
for the same do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament that  
is to say First I give my Soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my  
Body to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my  
Executor whom I shall hereafter mention and as for my worldly Estate as it hath  
pleased God of his goodness to bless me with in this life I give and bequeath in manner  
and form as followeth.

Item I give to my Son Henry Ten pounds Cash & one feather Bed and furniture.

Item I give to my Daughter Anne eight pounds Cash, one feather Bed & furniture & one  
Chest.

Item I give to my Son Robert after all my Duesful debts and funeral Charges are paid all  
the余数 of my Estate be it of what kind or Quality whatsoever I do appoint my  
Son John whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament In Testimony  
whereof I have hereunto put my hand and Seal the day and Year first above written.
