In the name of God Amen. I Elizabeth Moore of the Parish of
 St. Marcell in the County of Sussex Widow, being sick and weak of Body, but of perfect sound and
 disposing Sense, and Memory, do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament, And First of
 all bequeath my Soul unto God, hoping at the General Resurrection to have that reunited to my
 Body, and with both to enter into eternal Happiness purchased by my dear Redeemer Jesus
 Christ, my Body (Desire) may be buried in a Christianlike manner according to the discretion
 of my Executors. And as touching what Worldly Goods it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow
 upon me, as of my own Acquisition, them I dispose of in manner, & to the Persons following, viz.
 First, I give unto my Son William all the money he owes me, also a Red Coverlet.
 Also I give unto my Son Cypher Moore all the money he owes me (except fifteen Shillings, sixteen
 Shillings and nine pence) also a Red Coverlet of one feather Bed with all the things thereunto
 belonging.
 Also I give and bequeath unto my Grand Children, Elizabeth, William & Betty Children of Edward
 Cypher, by my Daughter Frances, to be equally divided amongst them, Nineteen pounds
 thirteen shillings & six pence, being the money due to me from the said Edward.
 Also I give and bequeath to my Grand Children William, John, and Elizabeth Children of John Vowell
 by my Daughter Susanna to be equally divided amongst them, that is, their Education fifteen
 pounds, sixteen shillings and nine pence, which Money is now in the hands of my Son
 Cypher Moore.
 Also I give unto my Daughter Frances Cypher two pounds (Dishes six Plates of one Basin, and also some
 Pinnas Current Money.
 Also I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Martha one Negro Boy called Bunker, two pounds Dishes
 six Plates, one Basin, one feather Bed Redsted and furnished a Red Coverlet a large Iron Bed
 a gray Mace, a pair of Stays, a black with Bonnet, a pair of Callimanco shoes of twenty pounds
 in Money.
 Also I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Anne, one Negro Woman called Betty of her Child Harry,
 two pounds Dishes, six plates, one Basin, one feather Bed Redsted and furnished, one Coverlet
 one flower'd Rug, a pair of Wheel, a small Iron Bed, a Mace, called June with the belt belonging to her
 a piece of Shinty, a pair of Callimanco shoes, and twenty pounds in Money.
 Also I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Lucy a Negro Woman called Hannah, two pounds Dishes
 six Plates, one Basin, one feather Bed Redsted & furnished, one Coverlet, a Woolen Wheel a gray
 belt a pair of Callimanco shoes, and twenty pounds in Money.
 Also I give unto my Son William in trust for the three of my Daughters Susanna Vowell six pounds in
 Money.
 Lastly I give unto my Sons William and Cypher Moore, all the residue of my Estate, they paying
 my Debts and Funeral Charges, and do constitute my said Sons William and Cypher Executors
 of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I do hereunto set my hand &
 affix my seal this twentieth Day of November, in the Year of Christ one Thousand seven
 Hundred and sixty.
