I give unto my son John Rawlings my biggest son part likewise my biggest Part of my land and deep.

I give unto my son Gregory Rawlings all the money as he has in his Possession be it little or much.

I give unto my son Richard Rawlings my mare two paviors before and one dist.

I give unto my daughter Mary 2 Dozen of paviors 1 before three deep and three paviors ones and 1 pavior dist the rough and three and 1 single Pluck

I give to my daughter Elizabeth two cows and one calf

I give unto my grandson Denny Rawlings one large flying pen

I give unto my grandson William Rawlings senior all my cow and likewise my smoking pipe both Case of tobacco

I give unto my granddaughter Sarah Rawlings all the cotton as is now growing and one Bed and furniture as first in the old house and one dist one Iron Pot one box Iron and one red washing Tub and one spinning wheel and one pair of bolin boards and the warp of 24 or 30 Yards and likewise cotton to fill in the said warp
