in Albemarle County being Very sick and weak but in Perfect sense and
Memory thank be to God therefore calling to mind the Mortality of my body and
Knowing that it is appointed for all Men once to die do make and ordain this my
Last will and Testament to my Principal and for to all Give and bequeath
my soul to the Merits of Almighty God that I have done and for my body I com-
mend it to the earth to be buried in a Christian Manner at that Discretion of my
Executors hereafter Mentioned Nothing doubting but at ^{the} Last day at the General
Resurrection I shall Receive the same again by the Almighty Powers of God and
touching such worldly Estate as it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow upon
this Life I Give and Dispose of the same in this Manner and form following
my will and desire is that after my funeral expenses and all my just Debts
be fully satisfied and paid my devise is to Dispose of what I have received of God
undivided as following.
